



A PROPOSAL FOR RAHWAY - to cut down on truck traffic on streets which are already congested and on which many children must walk - Councilman John Golla has revealed plans to study the possibility of extending Randolph Avenue to U. S. Route 21. His plan calls for construction of entrance and exit ramps at Route 21 and Randolph - so that trucks which now travel down Main Street to get to Route-81 would be able to get onto the highway at Randolph Avenue. This would also help alleviate some truck traffic from the East Hannibal - Lawrence Street area, which houses many children and which has had a school recently planned in Rahway and the construction of a truck terminal just over the line in Woodbridge, positive steps are necessary, Councilman Golla said.

Full directors of Councilman Golla's plans for the proposals he has indicated that he will bring up for discussion will be presented in full in the next edition of the "Rahway News-Record".
