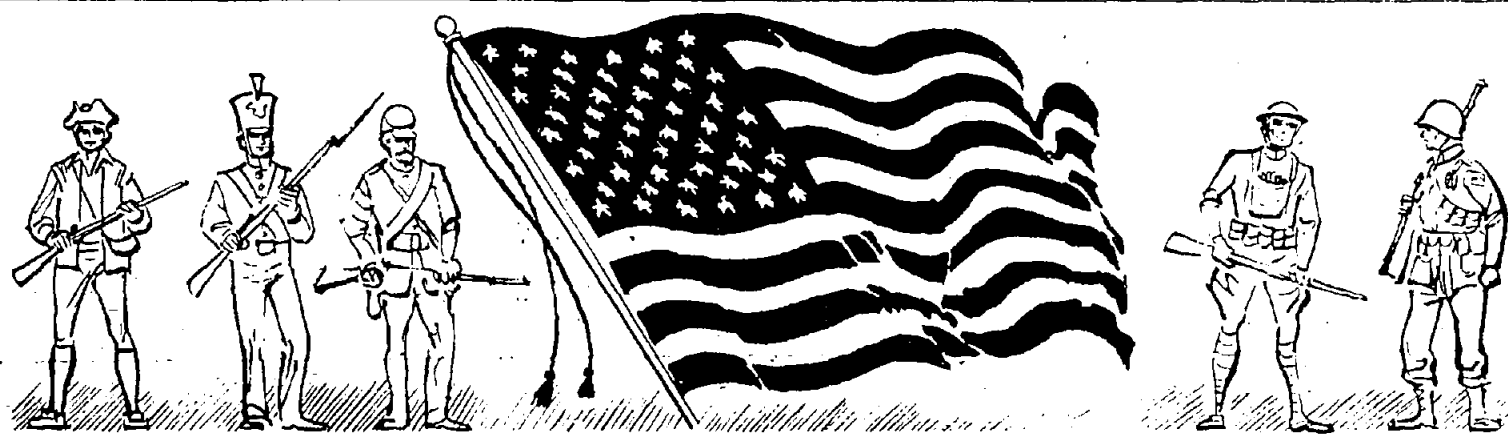

New Nursery School Set For Rahway

The picturesque setting of 2153 St. Georges Ave., Rahway, will soon be the home of the State Certified Busy Bee Nursery School.

The school will be under the direction of Mrs. Bernard Burkhoff, mother of three children, who holds a B. A. degree from Rutgers University and is a candidate for a M. A. degree in Early Childhood Development at Newark State College. Previously, she taught at Rolling Hills Nursery School in Metuchen and was a consultant on early childhood development and trained teachers' aides for the City of Newark.

The goals of The Busy Bee Nursery School will be to help each child become self-reliant, happy with other children, and aware of the rights of others. To accomplish this, a program designed around the individual needs of each child and the materials necessary for social, physical and emotional growth will be provided. The program allows for children to have experiences as well as exposure to good literature. Children will be helped to develop in the areas that will make future school experiences more meaningful.

Mrs. Burkhoff has announced that after renovation of the premises is completed, the school will open in September for children between the ages of three and five years old. Half and full day sessions are currently planned. A morning session from 9:00 to 11:30 A. M. and an afternoon session from 12:15 to 2:45 P. M. will be conducted. Coleman Urges Businessmen To Extend Their Interests

The Rahway Business Men's Association must extend its interest beyond the borders of each individual store and work together if Rahway is to become a thriving community for its 30,000 people, Joseph Coleman, Director of Community Relations, told association members at their meeting last week.

Mr. Coleman declared, "we must look sharp and build a better community pulsating with life and vigor." He also stated that the administration is going to need the large vacant areas along the back of Main St. and along the Rahway River to curtail the clouds of dust on the Main retail business area. Announcement was also made by Mr. Coleman that the first group of homes to be constructed on the tract will be started in August.

The businessmen voted to ask City Council for passage of an ordinance on rummage sales. The merchants would like to see the sales limited to Rahway groups and to have a limit of two sales a year in the business district for each organization.

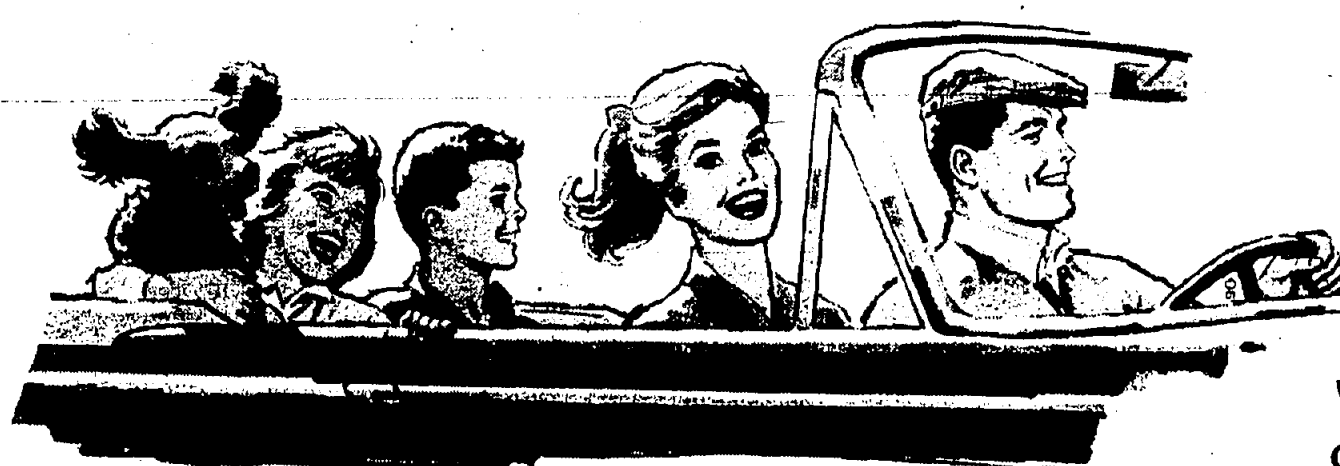

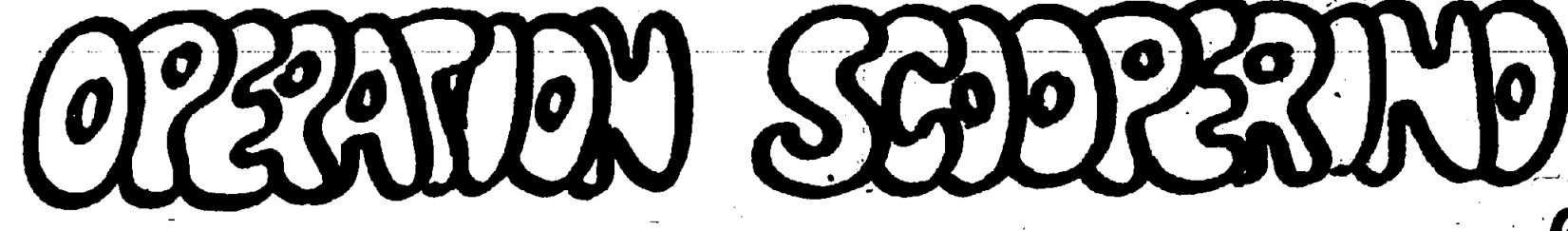
