Dems' Club Form Board to Curb 'Runaway Rents'

Formation of a housing board to prevent "runaway rents" and provide services for low-income tenants was announced by leaders of the Democratic Club in Rahway.

In revealing the plan, spokesman for the state's major building groups, a Senate hearing in Trenton that government-imposed rent control, rather than industry self-regulation, would produce a "housing horror" in New Jersey.

Spokesman for the New Jersey Builders Association, the Builders, Owners and Managers Association and the New Jersey Association of Realtors, said the State Senate Committee on Housing and Municipal Government that rent control in New Jersey would be abandoned by the state.
