The catalytic incinerator, as a back up for the scrubbing system, is expected to solve the occasional problem caused by normal operating situations, which are accentuated by some weather conditions that inhibit rapid dissipation of odorous Cost of the new installation is estimated at \$250,000, and the target date for operation is Sept. 1, the company said. The incinerator will destroy any residual odor-carrying compounds


