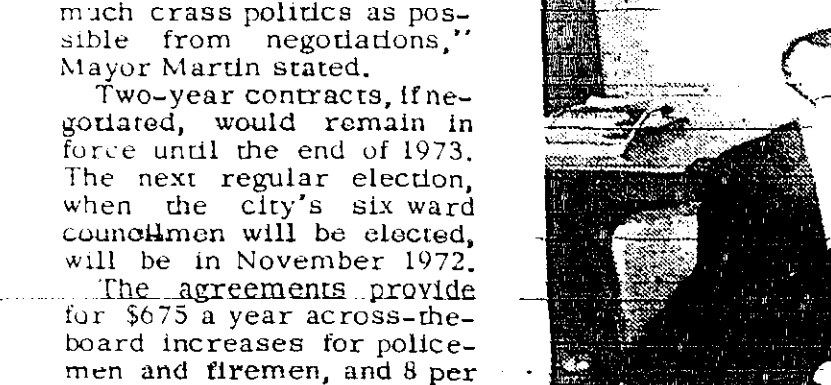

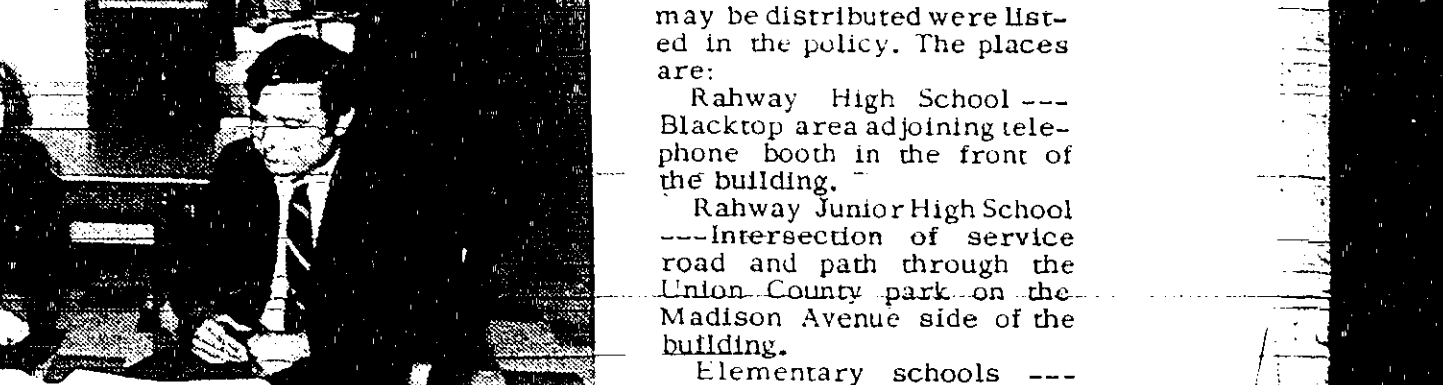

Canoists Advocate Exploring the Little Rivers for Adventure

New Jersey for many people means urban sprawl, the non-aesthetic vistas of swamps and industry viewed from the Turnpike and pollution of air and water. But James and Margaret Cawley, veteran canoeists, are trying to change this image in the revised edition of their book, "Exploring the Little Rivers of New Jersey," recently released by the Rutgers University Press. The book was first published in 1947.



One may explore this charming country quite quietly paddling a canoe down any one of the many little rivers of the state, "the authors declare. "Exploring by canoe enables one not only to savor the smell of the pines and cedars and observe the wildlife along the streams, but also to get to know the rivers in a way not possible otherwise."
