Mr. Lawrence said that "not a cent has been spent for exterior maintenance of City Hall" and that "practically nothing" has been done to maintain the police headquarters. "If we buy another building and fail to maintain it, it will go the same way as the present police headquarters," he stated. Adding that if he were in charge of maintenance, he would be ashamed, Mr. Lawrence said that the needs are plumbing repairs and roof repairs. Noting the plea for a new headquarters because of lack of space, he said the Municipal Court and the violations bureau were moved from the police building into City Hall.

As long as the city fails to maintain the properties it has, the city should forget to "add to the taxpayers' burden" by purchase of another building, Mr. Lawrence stated.
