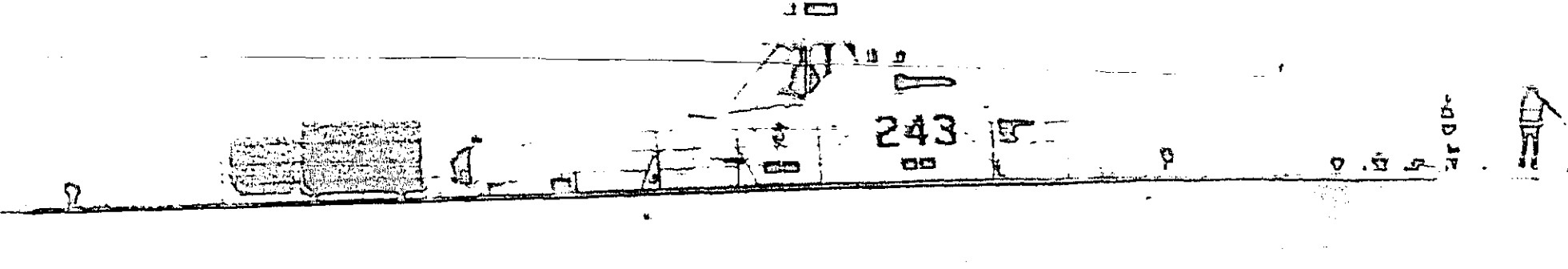

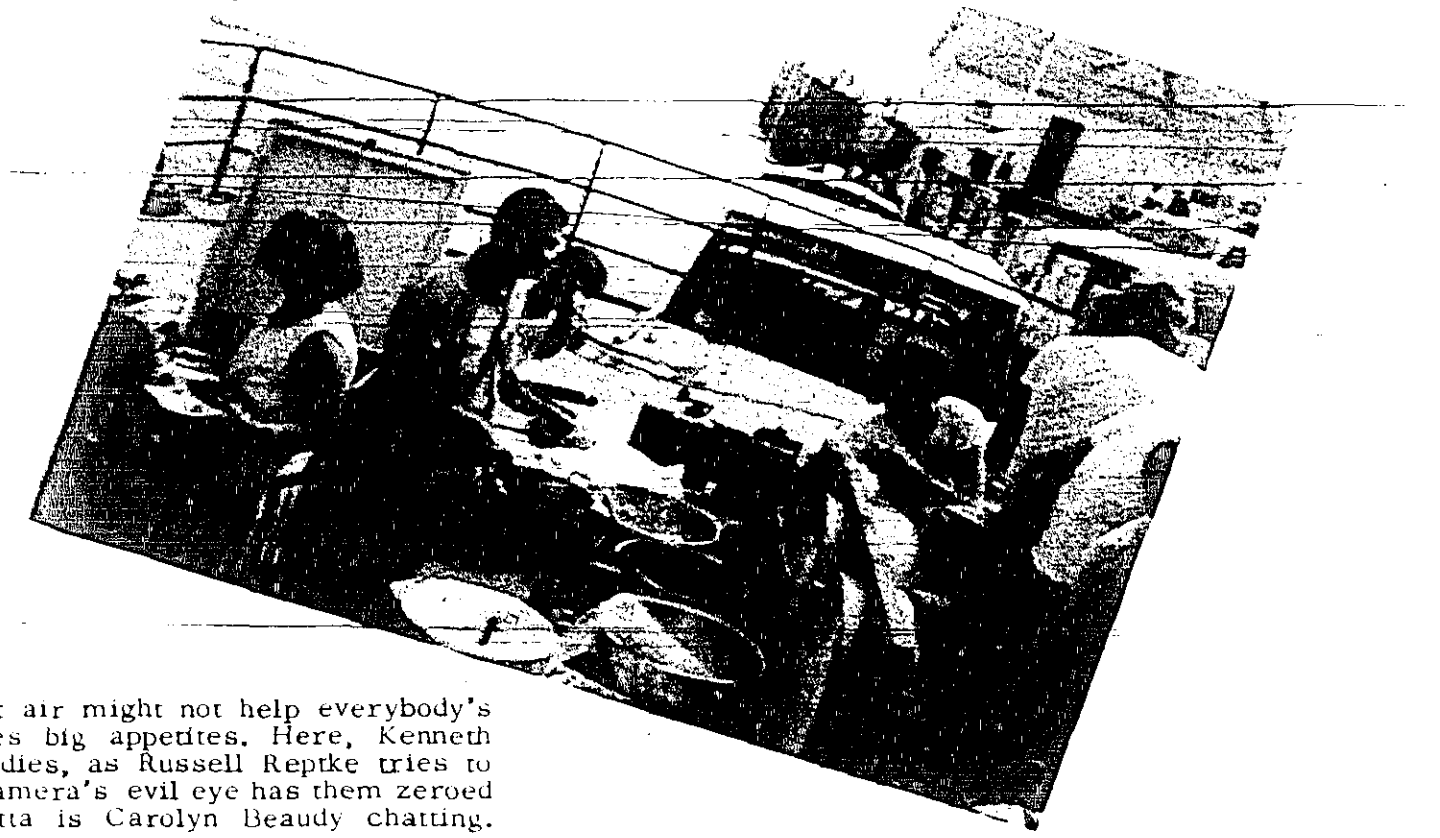

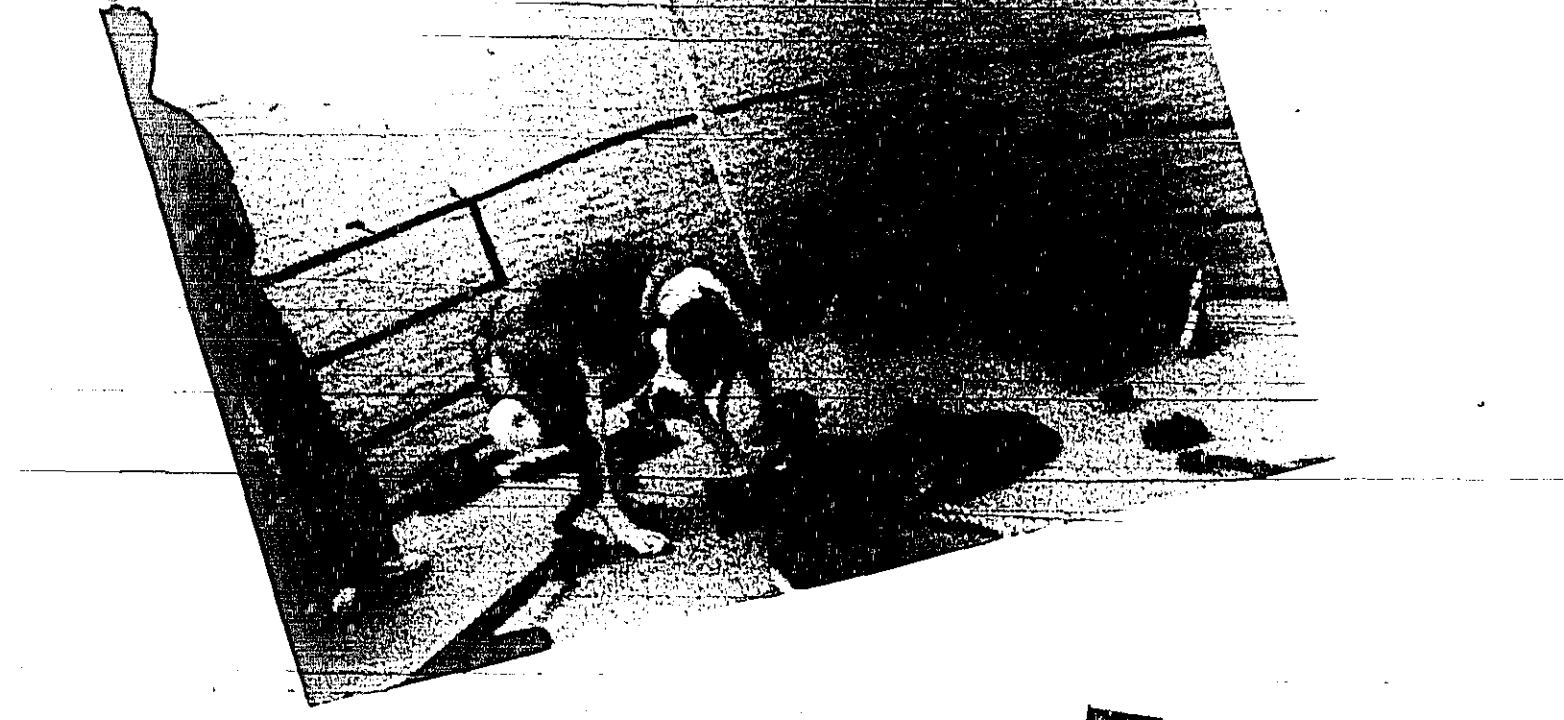

## State Board Threatened With Huge Tuition Costs Because of a New Law

### City Board Reports Surplus

A financial monster, created by the state, is threatening the Rahway Board of Education and other boards with huge expenditures because they must pay tuition costs for incalculable children, Edward J. Higgins, a member declared at Monday night's board meeting in Roosevelt School auditorium.

Mr. Higgins' statement was made before the board voted on three motions to place three Rahway children in institutions and to pay a total of \$8,420 a year for their tuition. The board voted to pay the tuition in accordance with a court order directing the State Bureau of Children's Service to place the children in institutions.

The Rahway board and other boards with similar in-correctible children placed in institutions must pay the costs as a result of a new state law, Mr. Higgins explained. "The change in the law, making local boards responsible for payment of tuition for children placed in institutions, was a monstrous thing which will become impossible to live with," Mr. Higgins stated.

The board member said that approximately \$20,000 would be spent by the board during the year for such tuition and predicted the cost next year would increase to \$100,000.

The juvenile court judges are going to dump the cases right in the taxpayers' laps," Mr. Higgins stated. Mr. Higgins voted against a motion to provide home instruction at New Jersey Boynton, Kearny, for a student at the tuition rate of \$230 a month. The eight other board members voted in favor of the motion but Louis R. Rizzo said he did so "regretfully."

### Law to Permit Ending of Lease Signed by Gov.

A bill which allows a husband or wife to cancel a lease for their dwelling if one of the marriage partners dies has been signed into law, Assemblyman Herbert H. Kiehn of Union County District 9-B, sponsor of the bill, reported today.

Assemblyman Kiehn, a Rahway resident, stated that the new law will be especially helpful to senior citizens, who, after the death of a spouse, find themselves confined to the rented dwelling place they have been occupying. The assemblyman noted that the law will permit widows or widowers to terminate the lease on any quarters rented to themselves or their family.

It was explained by Assemblyman Kiehn that the law provides that notice of termination may be given to the landlord by the leasee, the executor or administrator of the estate, or by the surviving spouse. Termination would be effective on the 90th day following receipt by the lessor of written notice and rent would have to be paid to the termination of the lease, the assemblyman said.

The law became effective Oct. 4. Leases executed before the 90th day following the signing of the bill by the governor are not affected by the new law, it was stated.

## Action to Halt Purchase of Elizabethtown Building by City Not Contemplated at Present States Taxpayers Leader

No action to block the purchase of the Elizabethtown Gas Company building at Central Avenue and Hamilton Street by the City of Rahway is contemplated as present by the Rahway Taxpayers Association, which opposed the acquisition. It was stated today by Altonzo W. Lawrence, its lawyer, at a Monday night board meeting.

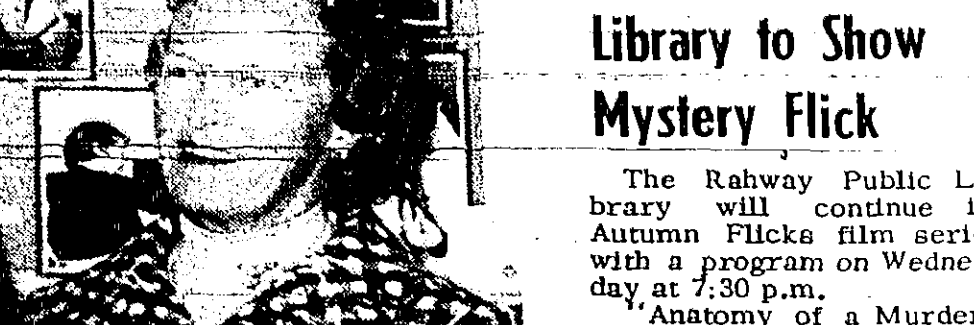

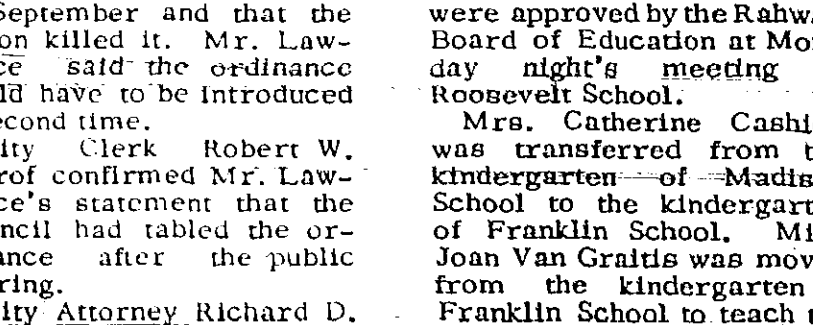
