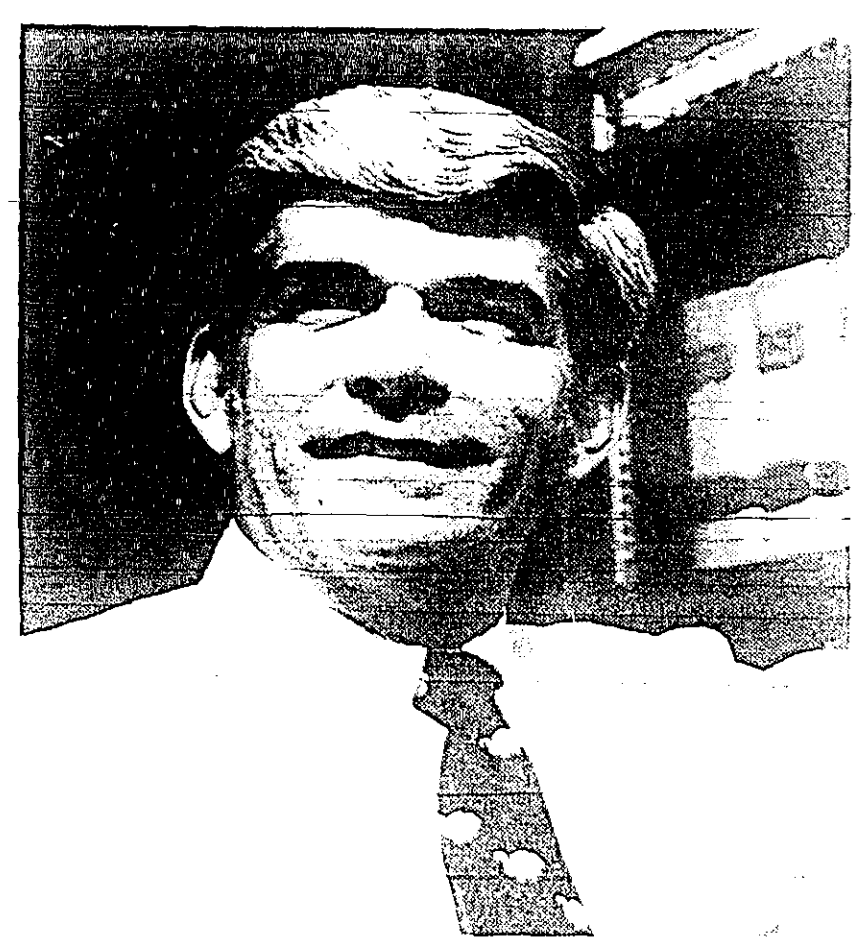

The Past and Future Are One
 The downtown business area in Rahway has made some strides recently. About half a dozen vacant properties have been rented, and the new businesses are a step in the direction of commercial growth. But while nearly all the stores are filled with goods, the entire downtown area needs a coordinated improvement plan.

In the Oct. 24 edition of the New York Times, their real estate section featured the downtown business area of Albia, Iowa, and how it refurbished rows of Victorian structures that were falling into decay.

The town of Albia, population 4,500, was founded in 1859, and most of its downtown area is about 100 years ago. The merchants learned an important lesson that "all change is not progress."

They organized and spent a modest \$150,000 in a paint-and-fix-up operation, dubbed Operation Facelift. Downtown Rahway is very similar to downtown Albia. The buildings are mostly of Victorian vintage or older and need serious facelifting. Rahway, like Albia, has its rows firmly set, and a start from scratch is impractical.

Albia has progressed by realizing and emphasizing its past. Their downtown area is a reflection of the most imaginative architectural art in American past, the Victorian, 1840-1900, and rather than modernize with glass, steel and neon, the town's merchants knew they could compete by emphasizing their gingerbread structures and the services of local retail establishments.

As the N. Y. Times article said, "Albia knows where it is. It also knows in its own words, that 'a community cannot separate its past from its future.'"

Stringent 5-Year Program Of Inspections Unveiled

A five-year code enforcement program was announced by Mayor Daniel L. Martin to correct frequent violations of housing, fire and health regulations.

The mayor said the action was "long overdue," and the first place to be reviewed for violations would be the downtown business sector and adjacent areas. Mr. Martin stressed that all violators would be prosecuted to the "fullest extent of the law."

The city is being assisted in its inspection effort by the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development and the State Department of Community Affairs.

"I will never tolerate anything that remotely resembles the beginnings of a ghetto," he stressed.

"At the end of five years, every building in the city will have been inspected, and there is no way to over-emphasize the importance of the program," he added.

Mr. Martin explained the city has been broken down into five areas for inspection purposes. He will assign inspectors, all carrying proper identification, will ask residents to let them inspect their properties. Residents should be sure, he said, to ask the inspector if there is any doubt in their minds about the status of their property.

The mayor said the inspections are necessary and are not meant to create any hardships. He said personal inspections of property are necessary because "a very small minority of citizens create hardships for everyone by allowing overcrowding and hazardous safety conditions to develop on property that they own."

"These conditions have to be wiped out and exterminated from the city. I am asking all our citizens to cooperate with the four inspectors and to keep in mind the overall goal of this program," he said.
