## Board Member Says State Prevents Appointment of Reading Supervisor

The Rahway Board of Education is "stopped by bureaucracy" of the State Department of Education in its attempt to hire a qualified supervisor for the public school system, James F. Kernan, chairman of the board's education committee, declared at Monday night's board meeting in Roosevelt school auditorium.

Kernan said the board, having recognized the need to improve pupils' reading skills, was ready to engage a woman with 18 years of experience in reading but that was in-tervened by the state department. He said the department's position could not be hired, the reason, Mr. Kernan stated, was the appointment was not taken care of in the mandatory reading supervisor's position.

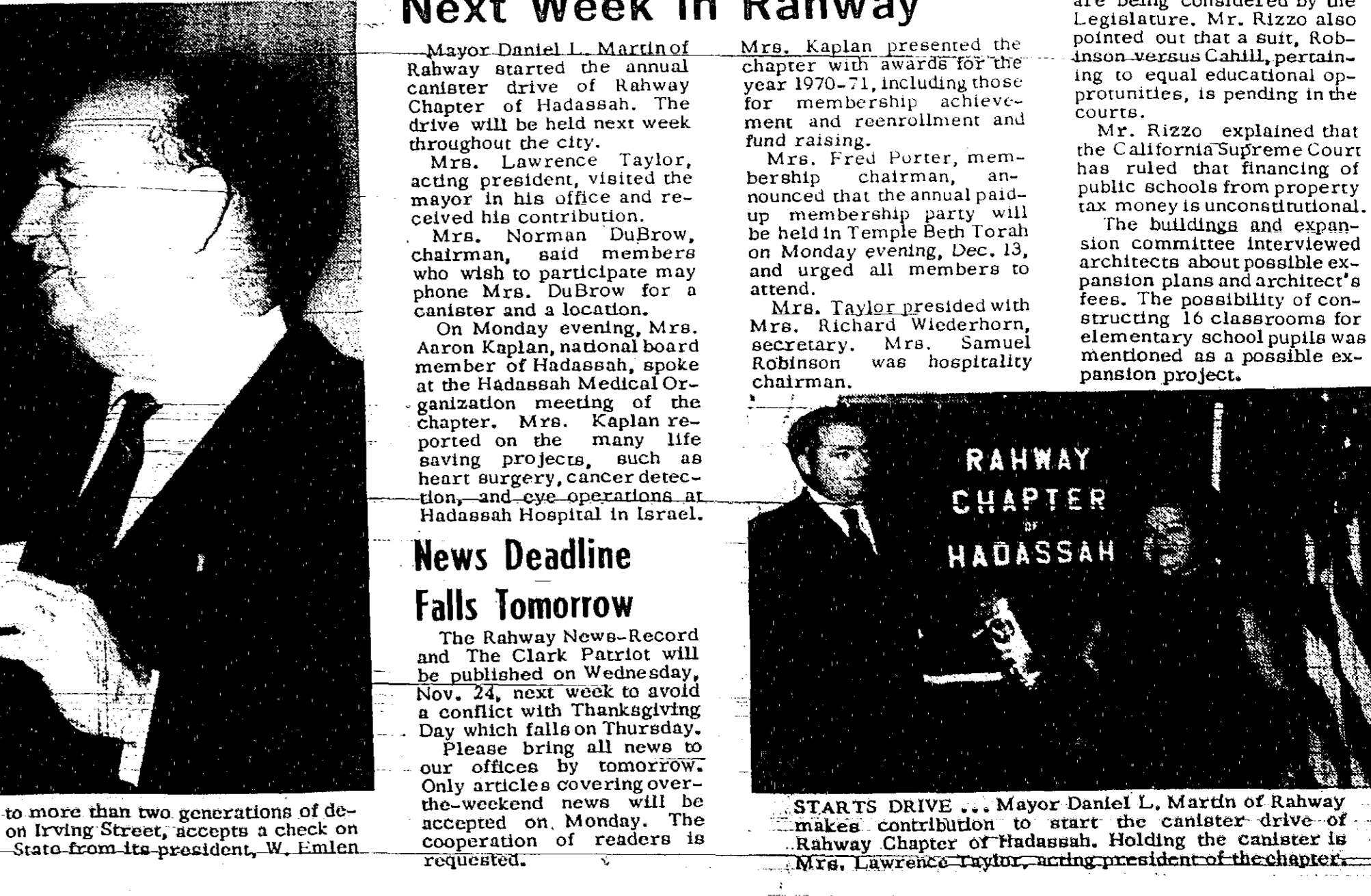

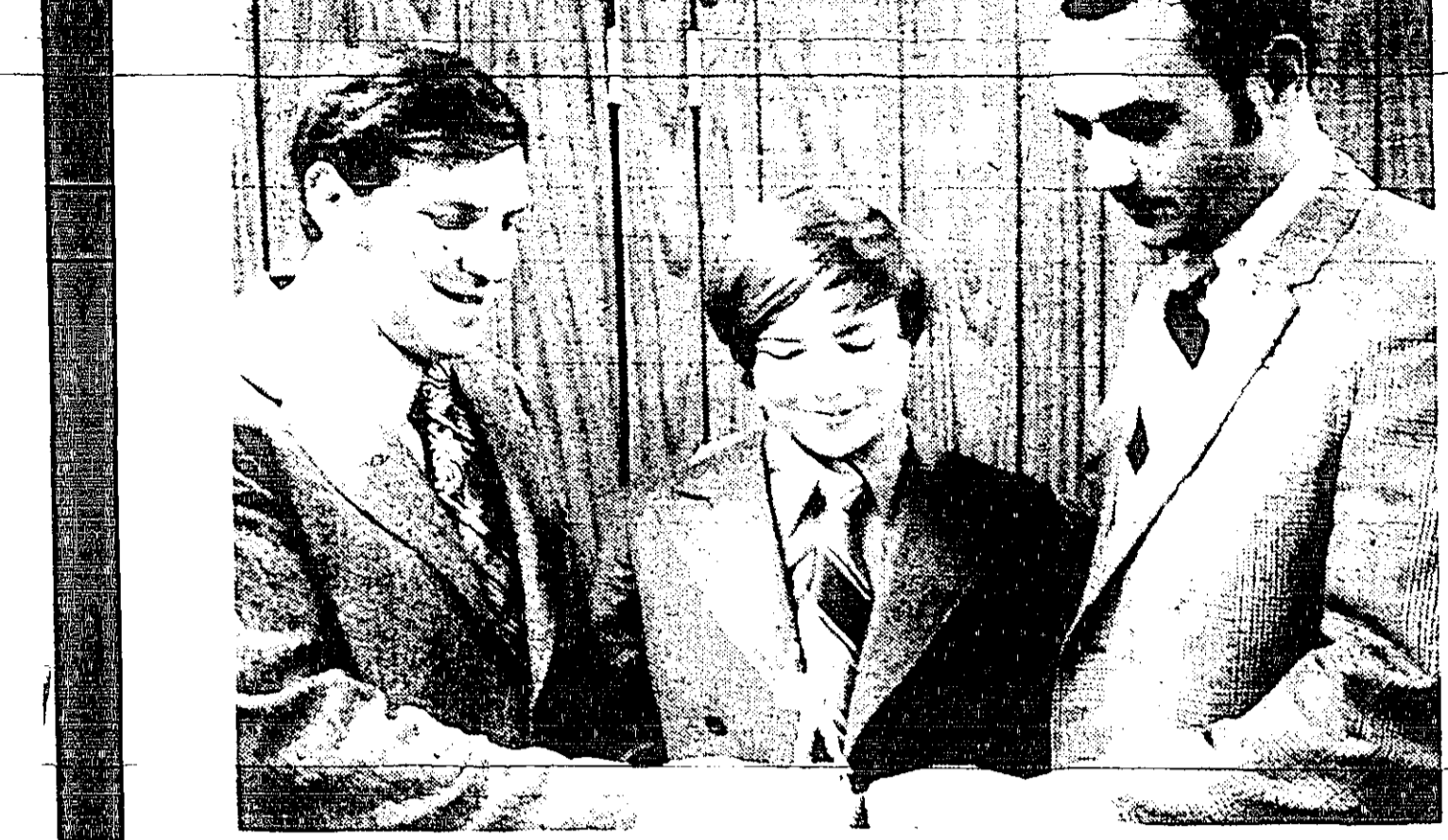
