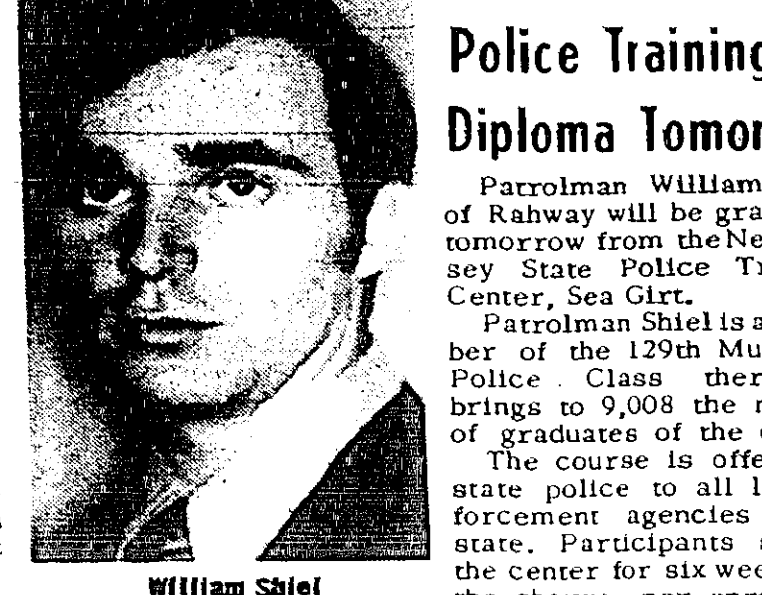

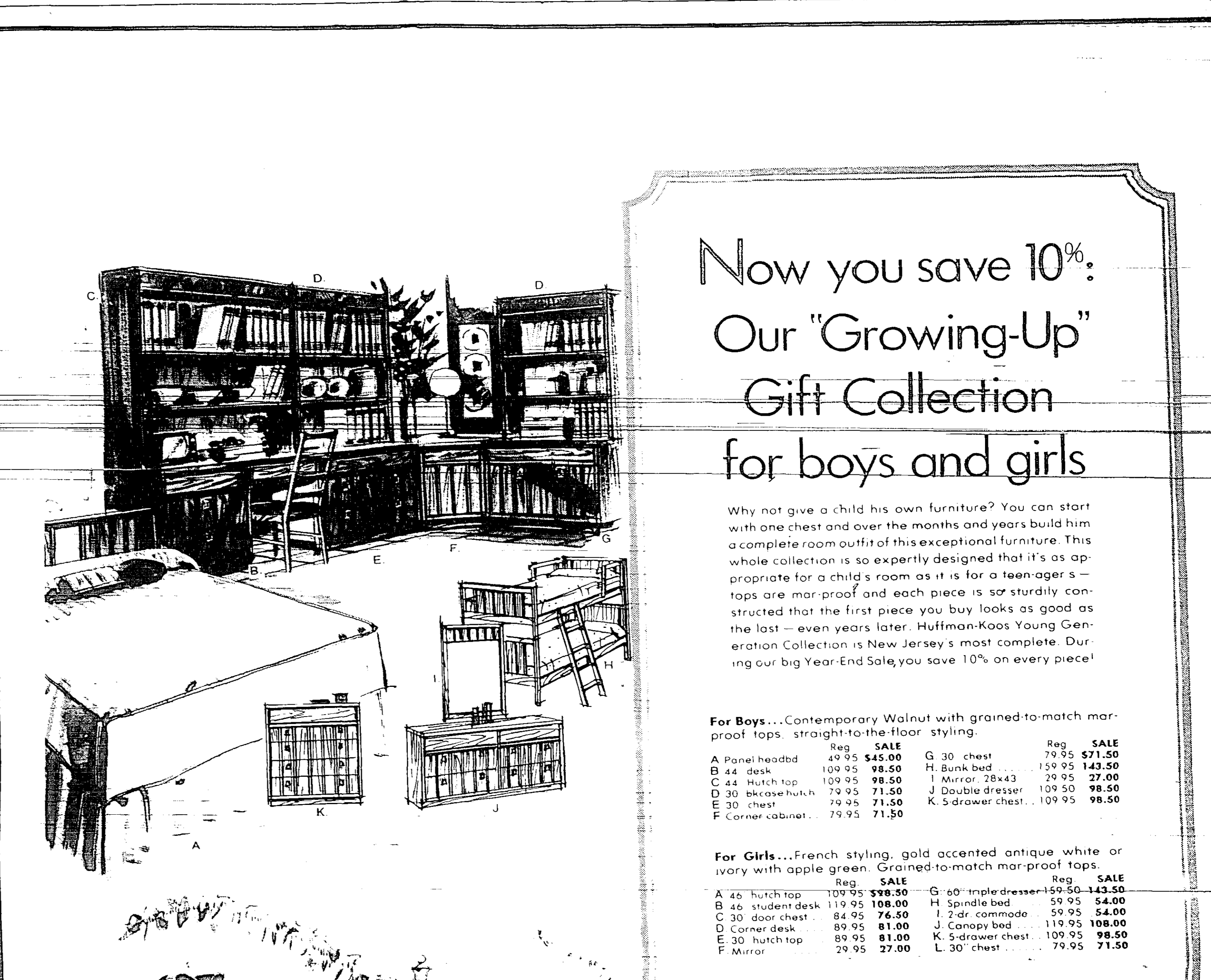
William S. Vorhaben of Westfield was named to the board of governors of Rahway Hospital by board president, James Smith, Jr.

Congressional Bill On 2nd Mortgages Seen Aiding Vets

A deferred second mortgage program recommended by the Veterans Administration received Congressional approval, the ex-GI who failed to qualify for VA guaranteed home loan will get a second chance.

Charles E. Searies, vice president of the Union County Multiple Lending Service, today said the VA plan, if passed by Congress, would benefit many veterans.

"It is specifically designed to help veterans whose present incomes are not high enough to enable them to obtain a first mortgage in a sufficient amount to complete the decision not to enter the prison."

The proposal now under consideration by Congress urges a deferred second mortgage guaranteed by the VA. As a result, the veteran would not be required to start making payments until three to five years after the purchase of a home.

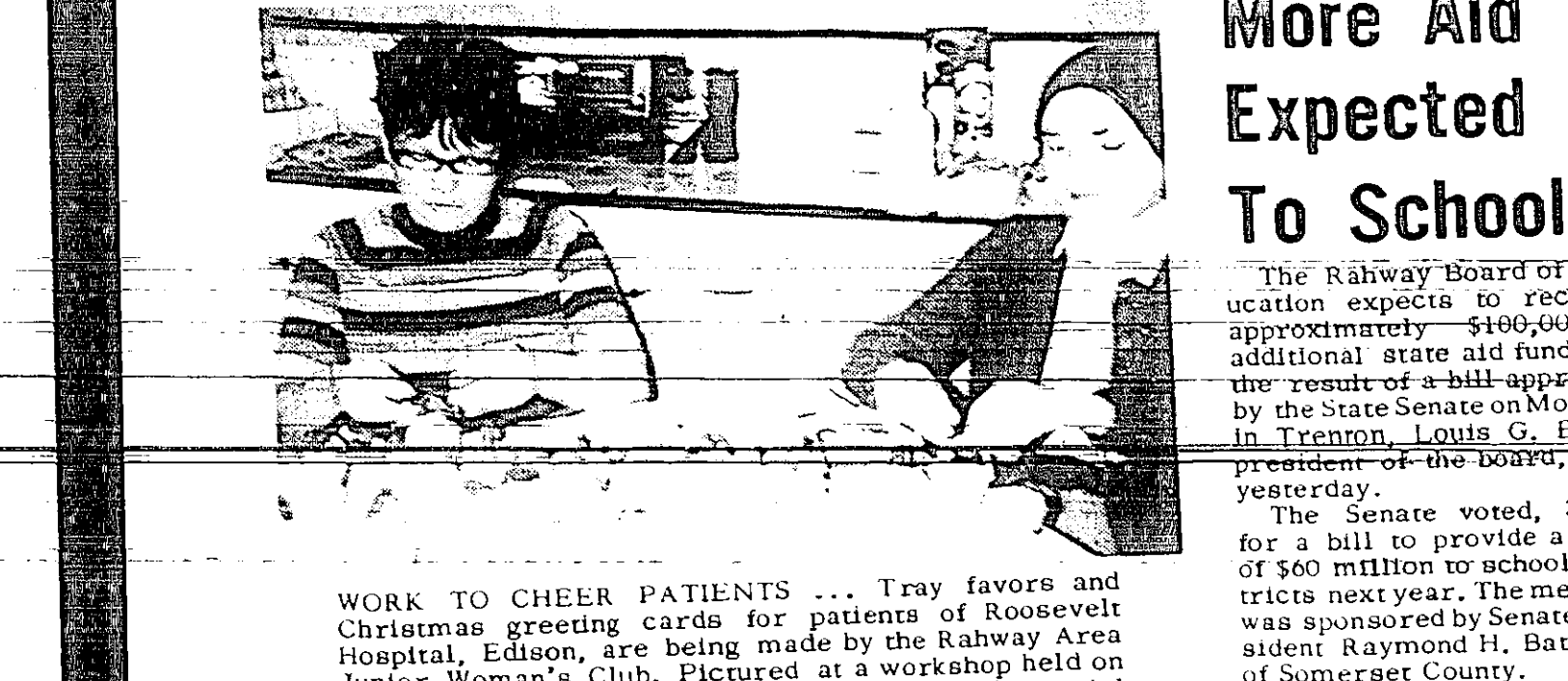
