## Oak Ridge Purchase Will Be Stalled Until An Accurate Appraisal Is Made

Those asking the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders to purchase the Oak Ridge Golf course have arrived at a juncture with reality: Where is the money for the acquisition to be found?

There is no doubt in the minds of our educational staffs from getting involved in the purchase, financing and maintenance of the proposed course. The golf course would be a burden on the county, and the appraisal obtained by the Union County Park Commission to a joke—the appraisal did the job between \$2.3 and \$3.3 million. How anyone could take an appraisal seriously that means \$3 million in excess, especially when one considers that the "questimate" could be off by more than 40% of the estimate of the total worth of the land.

A figure of \$5 million was bandied about for a while, and other estimates were also made.

All this inaccuracy and sheer lack of common sense might have the effect of killing the possible purchase of the site by the county, which, at least, a viable idea which will never have any possibility for fruition if an accurate appraisal is not forthcoming.

And while dreams and lack of professional art being dispelled, we might also make the point that if the county is to purchase the site, it will never be self-sustaining. The purchase must be made with the realization that the good that is accomplished by the purchase—prevention of additional runoff which causes flooding, added recreational areas, and much needed open space—costs, it doesn't pay in terms of dollars. The other golf sites make money only because the land was purchased at a time when real estate values were considerably lower.

Mayor and Freeholder-elect Thomas A. Kazmarek of Clark has warned very properly in an article in this issue that money must be sought immediately. There is also the possibility that state and federal monies will not be forthcoming for the purchase, then Clark should consider purchase of, at least, some of the property for recreation, while the remainder is developed. This alternative might have to be considered.

The question left this land remain industrially zoned for seven years and part of the difficulty now encountered is from a lack of accurate appraisal.

It should also be made clear that the "appraisal" obtained by the park commission is low. ## Vast Majority of Speakers Oppose State Financing of Local Schools

The Rahway News-Record and the Clark Patriot recently voiced strong objections to the proposed state bills, S. 226 and S. 227, which would finance schools throughout the state by means of a state property tax at the rate of \$2.25 per \$100 of true value.

A hearing on these bills was held last week before the Senate Education Committee, and a vote of 10-10 was taken. The bill was defeated by a vote of 10-10.

## State Funding and Control Threaten Aspects of Freedom in Local Schools

Edward J. Higgins, a member of the Rahway Board of Education, warned citizens at the Nov. 20 meeting of the board that the initiation of state educational programs in the local school systems could mean financial disaster for those systems in the future when state fiscal programs are dropped, leaving local taxpayers to foot the bill.

Most of these programs are clearly non-essential. In fact, most of them are so essential because they are interest groups manage to corner a sufficient number of state legislators into funding them.

The New Jersey Education Association, just like a manufacturers' trade group, is always promoting schemes to entice the pockets of its members which may or may not be in the best interest of the state and its communities.

Specialized programs mean high-paid personnel, more dues, greater influence. It's the Parkinson's Law of the educational establishment.

Mr. Higgins' comments were directed at the motion picture to apply for funding of a program in the high school to set up high school equivalency for 1972-73 at no cost to the participants, no matter what their economic background. The cost to the board is one-third of the total cost of approximately \$5,000.

Mr. Higgins pointed out well that the participants can afford to pay, and the general taxpayers should not be forced to provide funds for special individual improvements which are not mandated by state law. One can imagine that dire day when the state will mandate these programs for which initial monies were provided but for which continuance funds are denied.

The bureaucrats are waiting in the wings to administer a state-financed and state-run educational system which will help to kill participation in the administration of the public school system by public spirited individuals and local boards of education.

State-run school systems in Europe have always been great centers for power struggles in an effort to indoctrinate the young. They have also been the focus by which totalitarian movements sprang to fruition. The youth movements, the communist cell organizations and other radical doctrines are the diseases to which state-run school systems have been susceptible. There is no reason to believe that American schools will be immune to these movements which are always aimed at the concentration of power.




