





The evaluation "will help determine if the student matter covered by those teachers was consistent," according to the report. It was recommended that conferences in the elementary schools should be held approximately four weeks after school begins rather than early in November, It was felt that by November a student's scholastic problem would be reflected in the marks recorded on his or her first report card. It also was recommended that more daily work papers and test papers
