Regional Information Office Releases Summary Of 1972-73 Budget Which Shows 8% Increase

A summary and analysis of the 1972-73 budget of the Union County Regional High School District No. 1 was prepared by the office of information of the regional system. Each budget category is followed by an explanation of the change from the 1971-72 budget year. ADMINISTRATION This account finances the management of the total school system. It includes the salaries of the board of education and superintendent of schools, as well as their secretarial and clerical help and expense, audit and legal services and election expenses. Salaries for 11,172 clerical and secretarial positions and for six administrative positions are included in this account. There is a decrease of \$29,579 in this account, largely due to shifting their workshop expenses to the transportation account. There have been staff changes which have reduced the total salary account.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES Included here are expenses of all school athletic programs, athletic team expenses. It includes the cost of school bands, transportation and coaching fees and for all kinds of instruction. This account provides for all salaries of teachers and principals as well as clerical assistance for these people. Also contained here are funds for audio-visual materials and teaching supplies of all kinds. This account provides for all salaries of four principals, four assistant principals, 17 supervisors, 342 teachers, school librarians, 26 guidance and psychological personnel, and 59 secretaries and clerks. An increase of \$42,584 in this account will provide eight additional teachers to meet an expected enrollment of 5,815 students in 1972-73; additional in-service summer workshops for teachers planned to improve teaching skills and educational instructional materials for the benefit of children; additional materials to cover increased costs of teacher supplies and textbooks and anticipated salary increases for the present instructional staff.

ATTENDANCE Salaries of four attendance personnel and one system social worker are included here. The \$4,167 increase in this account is partly for projected pay increases and partly because the current year's expenditures will exceed the 1971-72 budget by nearly \$3,000.

HEALTH SERVICES Salaries for four school physicians and four dentists, five and a half school nurses, two speech therapists, and two clerical personnel as well as money for medical supplies make up this account. An increase of \$3,111 is proposed. This includes a 5% adjustment in the pay of the four school physicians and four dentists.

TRANSPORTATION This account covers the cost of transporting students to the four high schools and non-public schools. Salaries for one transportation supervisor and two and a half bus drivers are included. A \$4,841 decrease is needed here based on the needs presently forecast.

PLANT OPERATION This account reflects the cost of keeping the school buildings open and running, including cleaning, heating, lighting, telephone, casting for grounds and other activities. An increase of \$4,735 covers salary adjustments for 33 custodians, two groundskeepers and higher costs of utilities and supplies.

MAINTENANCE Salaries of six maintenance workers, money for contracted maintenance and repair services and money for replacement of instructional and non-instructional equipment are all included in this account.

\$2,000 in Valuables Taken from Home On Thomas Dr., Clark, Last Thursday

More than \$2,000 in jewelry and cash was taken in a break Jan. 6 from the home of William Lonsell, 61 Thomas Dr., Clark, police said. The loot from a ransacked bedroom included at least \$1,000 in jewelry and an undetermined amount of cash and other items, police reported. Water System Contract Given To Dan-Bro Co.

A contract was awarded by the Rahway Municipal Council to Dan-Bro Constructors Corp., Scotch Plains, for water distribution system improvements. The cost of the improvements is \$414,830.

Award of the contract to Dan-Bro was recommended to the Council by Frank P. Kocur, director of public works and city engineer, after bids were received and reviewed.

The governing body awarded a contract to K.N.S., Hillside, for a foundation, valve pits, pipelines and appurtenances required for the 1.5-million gallon water tank being erected for the city's water department. The cost of the work is \$158,775.

The only other bidder was H. Reid who submitted a figure of \$164,250.

The bid of the South Orange Contracting Company, South Orange, of \$25,775 for construction of water mains on Barrett and Beacon Streets and E. Scott Avenue was accepted.

The Council petitioned the Union County Board of Prothonotaries to reimburse the city for the cost of repairs made on the county bridge on Hamilton Street. The governing body asked the county to pay \$4,000.

The Council accepted three projects completed by the D & L Contracting Company Inc. The projects were construction of pavement curbs and storm sewer in Montgomery Street, construction of pavement curbs and storm sewer in Park Street, and construction of pavement and storm sewer in Hamilton Street.

Rate of Interest For Loans Cut By State Bank

Mayo S. Sleser, chairman of the board, and Anthony D. Scholari, president, announced this week that interest rates on certain types of loans were reduced on Jan. 1 by Franklin State Bank.

All collateral loans, whether secured by marketable securities or savings accounts, are reduced by 1/2 of 1% but the loans must pay the maximum legal rate possible on its savings accounts. The rate is 5 1/2% on one-year accounts.

To stimulate borrowing, the bank also recently announced a substantial reduction in its auto loan rates. Residential mortgage interest rates have been cut to as low as 3 3/4%. The latter rate reduction is believed to be the first break below the 7 1/2% figure offered by other banks in the state.

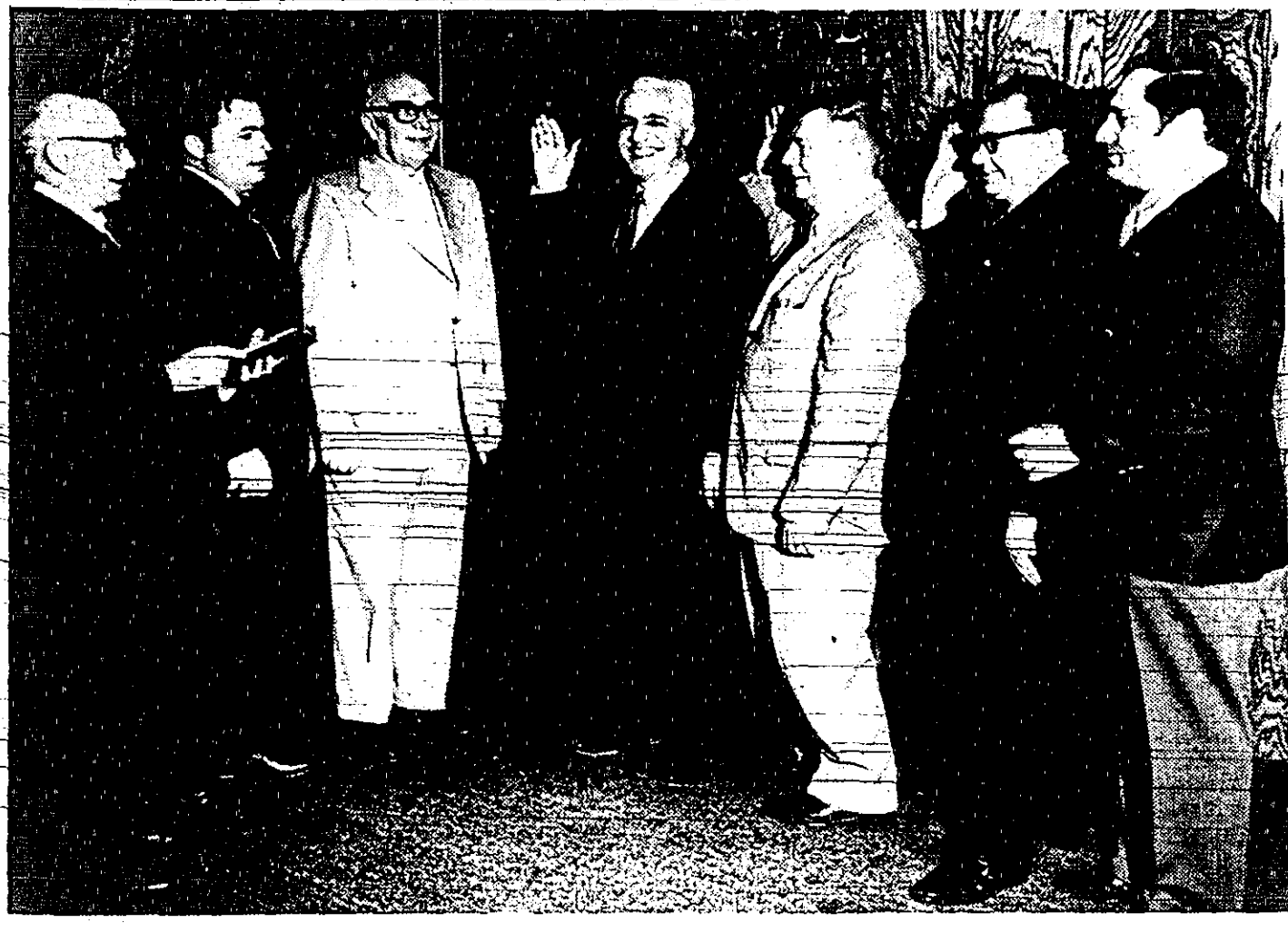
Health, Beauty Courses Attract Large Following

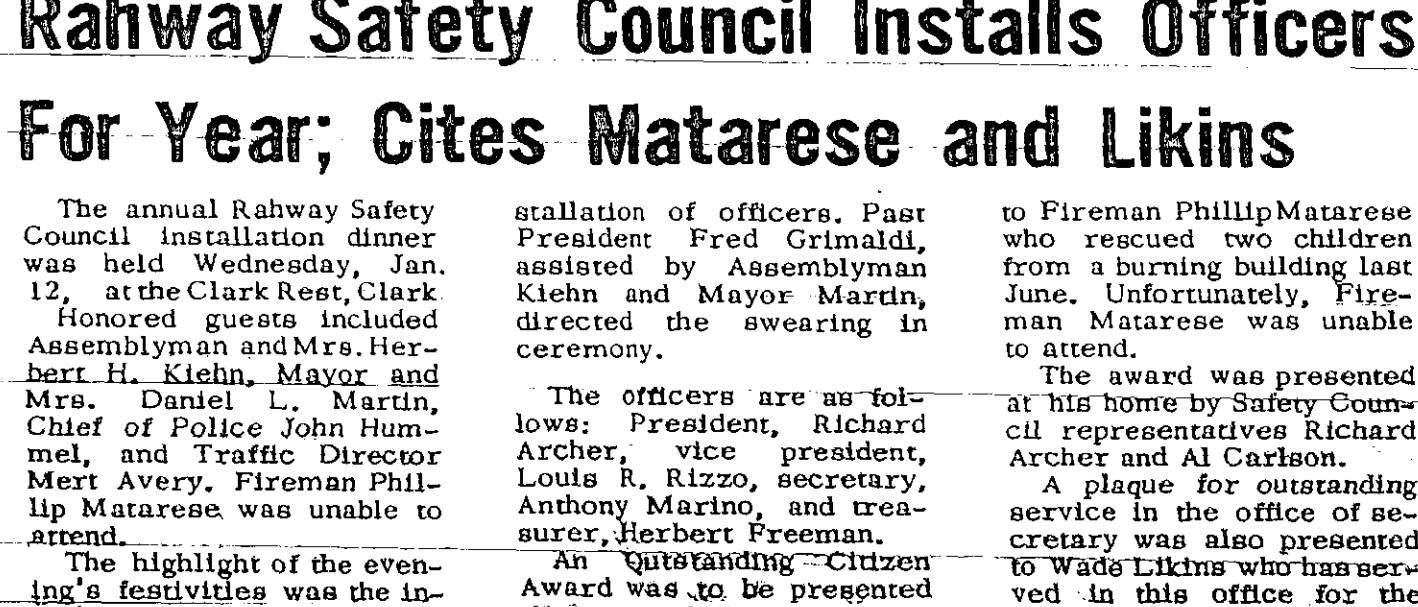
Girl Scouts Aid In Art Display At Menlo Park

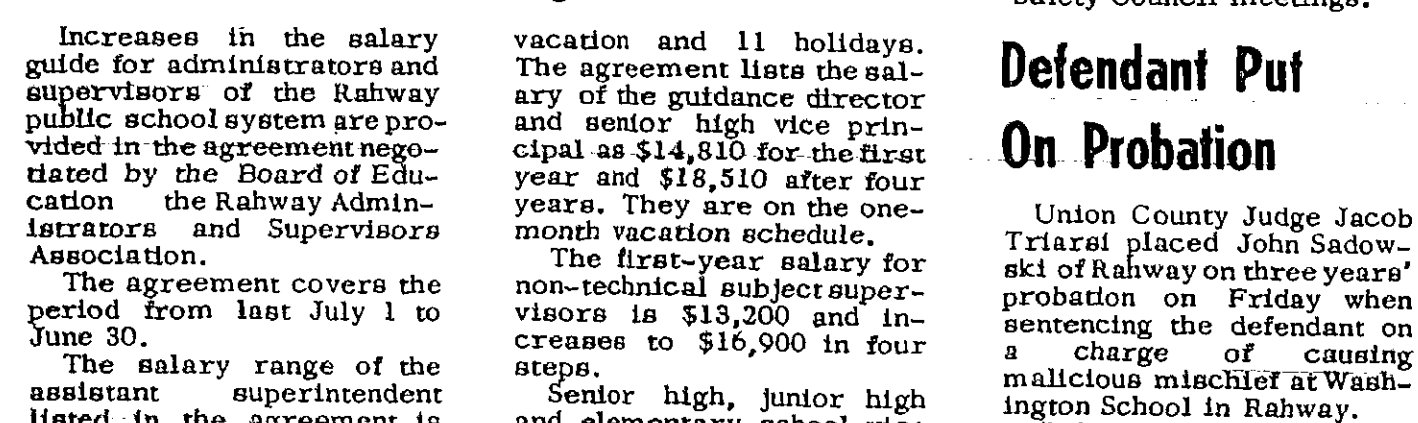

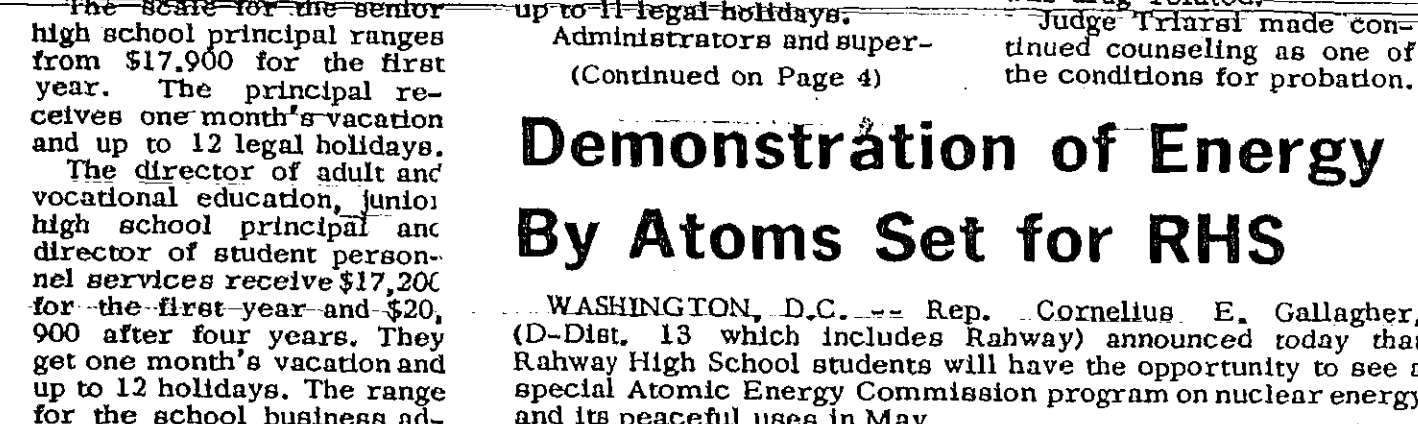

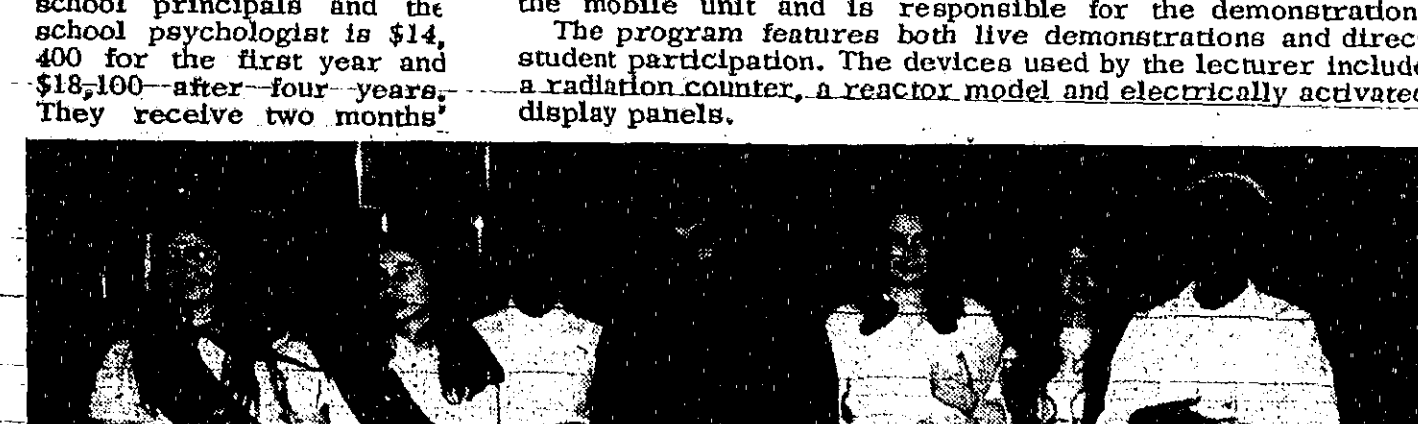

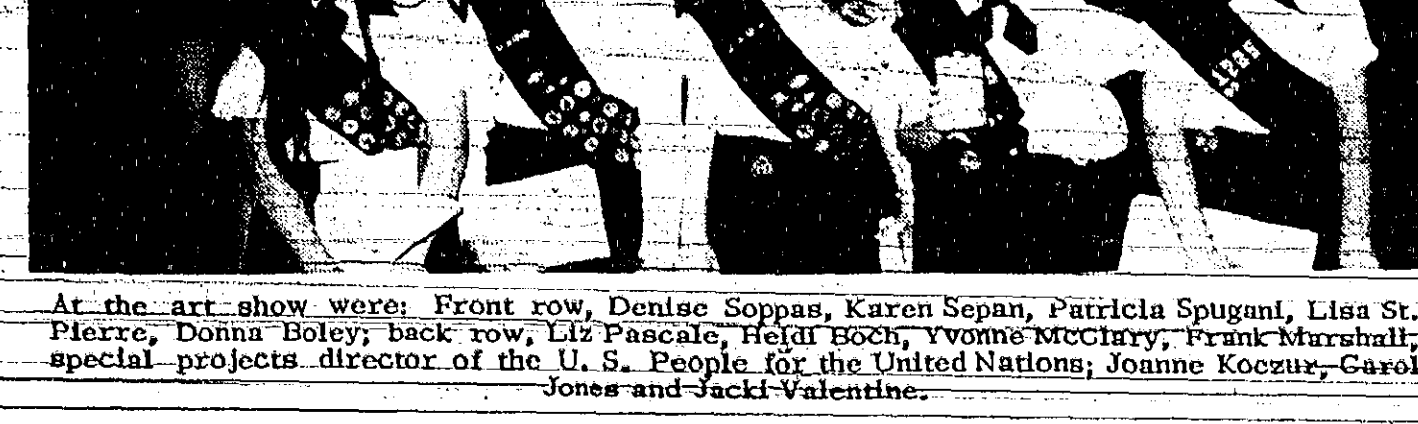
