Central Ave. Flooding Must Be Corrected

The Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders better start ininking about remedial action to solve the serious flooding problem on Central Avenue in cont of Bartell's Farm and Garden Supplies. Central Avenue is a county-maintained road with the heaviest traffic of any county roadway. Having it blocked by flood waters is just absurd when a sewer with a pump would do the trick. There are no great problems here, just the need for board of freeholders to assume its responsibility to maintain those roadways over which it has jurisdiction. Clark has two residents on the freeholder board, William J. Maguire, a former mayor, and the present mayor, Thomas A. Kaczmarek. The county has plans to widen and improve the roadway in cooperation with the state, but it would be well to correct the flooding problem instead of waiting until this large project finally gets started.
