State Property Taxation Increases But Sharp Upward Climb Slackens

Still upward-bound, but less steeply, the slightly encouraging picture of property taxation in New Jersey in 1972 which has emerged from the town-by-town, county-by-county study conducted annually by the New Jersey Chamber of Commerce.

This year's levy, the chamber finds, comes to \$2.4 billion over 1971, an increase of 9.8%, considerably less than the 13% increase in 1971.

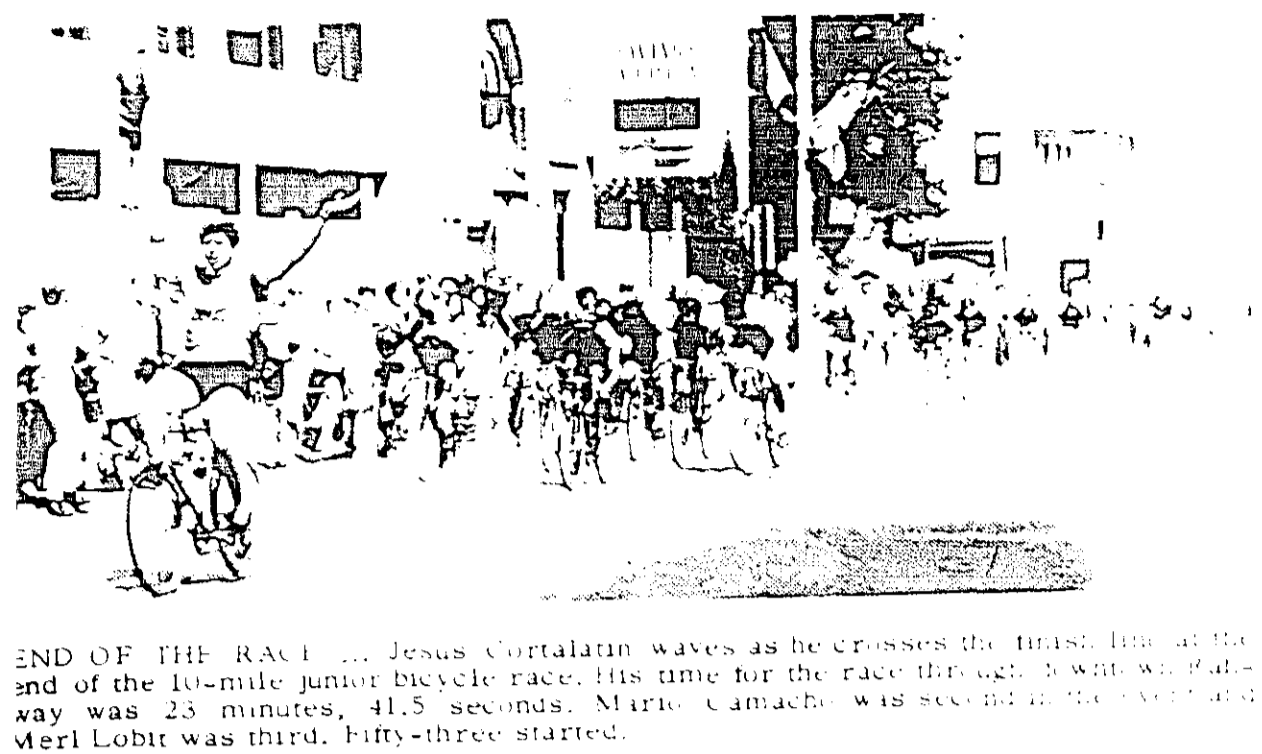

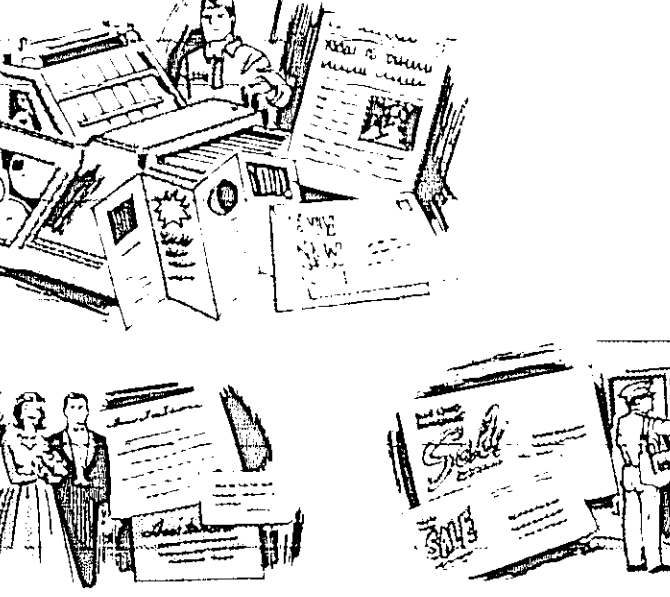

69 Homes in County Closed with NJ Funds

The New Jersey Mortgage Finance Agency will make \$22.8 million more in the available last November mortgage loans available to borrowers at low interest rates to buy moderate priced homes.

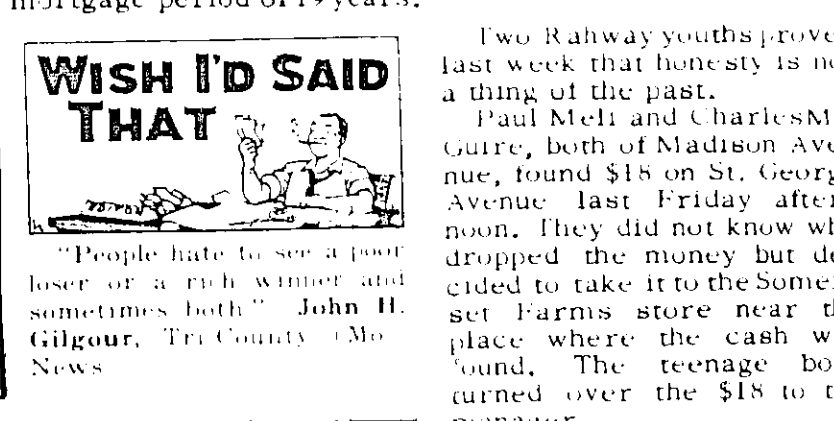
The manager recalled that he gave \$18 in change to Carol Kellaway, 14, of 244 Lehman Street earlier in the day.
