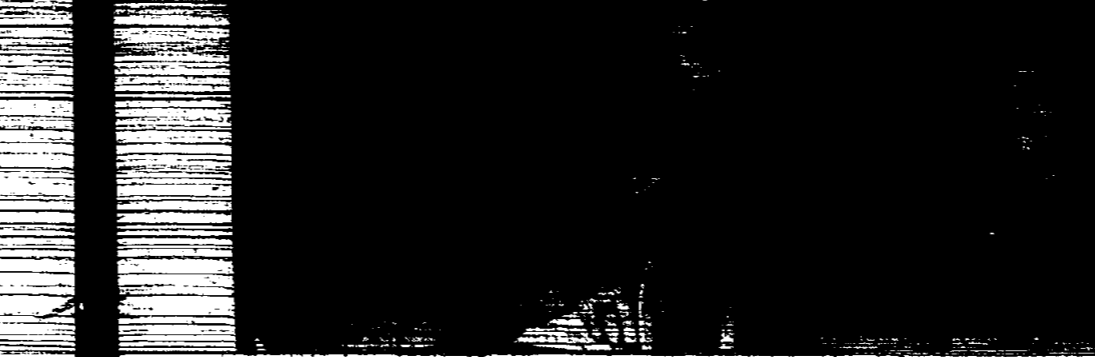

## Soaring postal rates threaten existence of many publications

Americans who have waited a first-class letter since March 2 have already felt the sting of the new postal rates. The 35% increase in postage rates is a medicine compared to what is happening to users of second-class mail services.

Newspapers and magazines are also affected. In 1973, the year after Congress passed a postal reorganization act and ordered that by 1976 almost every class of mail must pay for its own share. On its face the requirement appears logical. However, when applied practically, the act is a disaster.

Of the 200,000 newspapers and magazines in the United States, only about 100,000 are classified as first-class. The rest are classified as second-class. The postal rates for second-class mail are significantly higher than those for first-class mail.

The act requires that by 1976 almost every class of mail must pay for its own share of the cost of running the postal service. This will result in a 30% to 40% increase in postage rates for most publications.

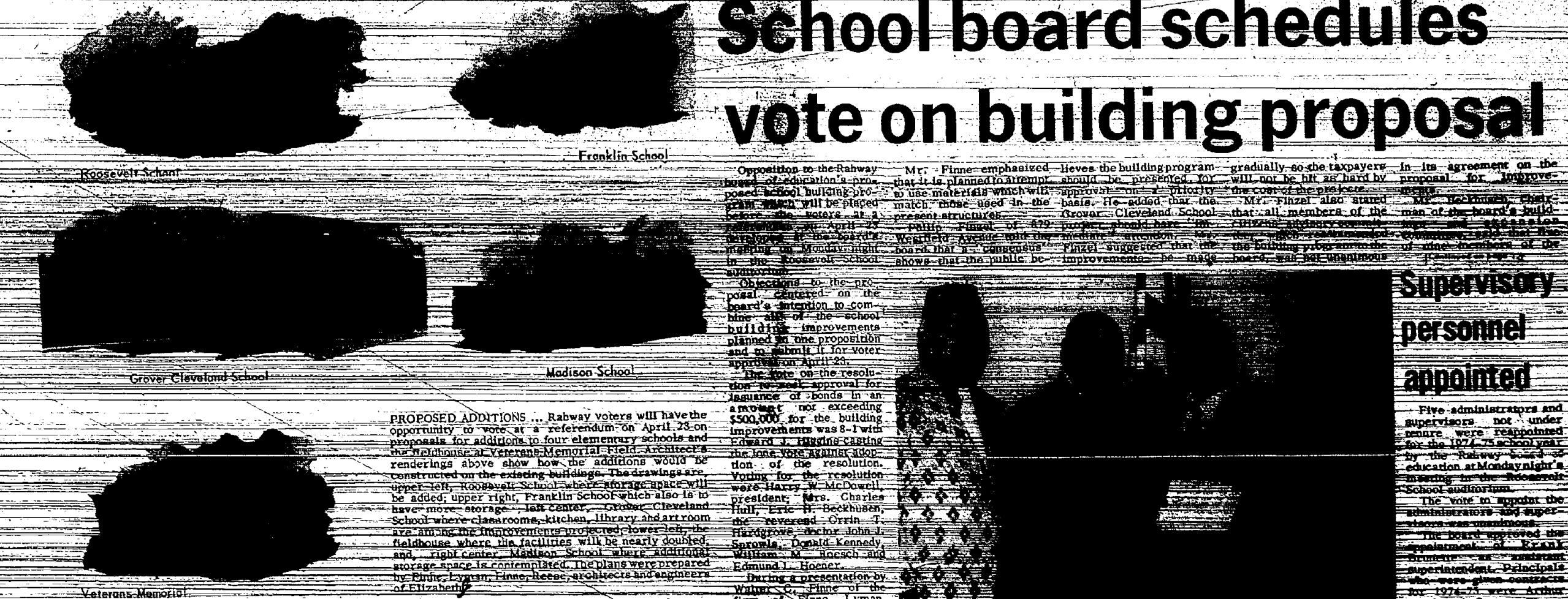
