### Federal house was owned by Jonathan Woodruff, prosperous 19th century merchant and benefactor

Throughout the long span of Rahway's history several of its most notable citizens have helped to guide the city in its development. One such gentleman was a Jonathan Woodruff who left his mark on the area of local economics, politics, philanthropy and architecture.

Mr. Woodruff was born September 1, 1815 on a 30-acre farm which was located on St. George Avenue between Elizabeth and Rahway. At the age of 17, he came to Rahway to learn the carriage trade. He worked as a cooper for 10 years and decided he would like to go into business for himself.

In the early 1840s, he opened a general merchandising store in Rahway. Woodruff was rapidly successful and his reputation as a substantial business man.

Mr. Woodruff never lost his interest in the carriage industry, selling both carriages and carriage parts. In his spare time, he found it profitable to give his full attention to the carriage trade. He worked as a cooper for 10 years and decided he would like to go into business for himself.
