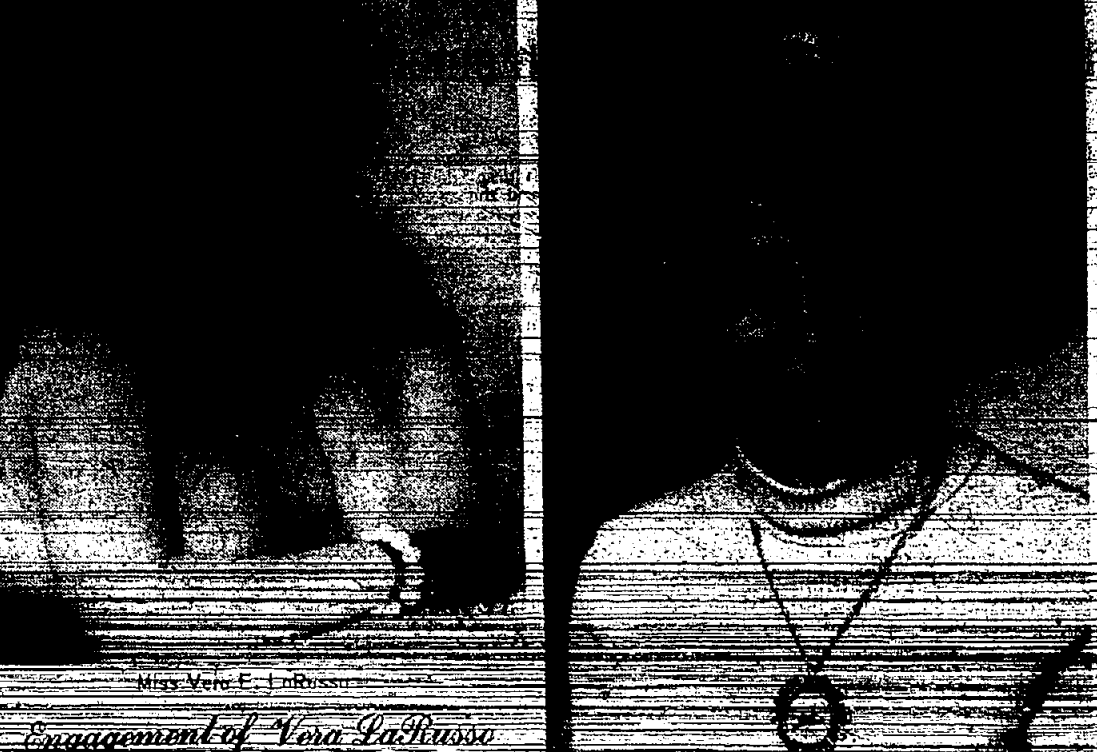

From ornate, plush wooden structures the modern telephone booth emerged

The first was made with a barrel hoop, draped with blankets forming a shelter to instrument and telephone, and it saved a young engineer from being evicted from his lodging in a Boston rooming house.

The first public coin telephone was a telephone "booth," and it was fashioned by Thomas Watson, the assistant to Alexander Graham Bell, inventor of the telephone.

Mr. Watson dreamed up the telephone booth as a means of muffling his shouts into the instrument while performing experiments in his room. Although he found crawling into the booth a "very embarrassing experience," the result was a "very successful" complaint of other boaters.

Mr. Watson was unsuccessful in selling the idea in the local telephone company. But Mr. Gray persisted, and with the aid of local backers founded the Gray Telephone Pay Station Company, which installed the first public coin telephone in 1899 on the roof of a Hartford bank.
