

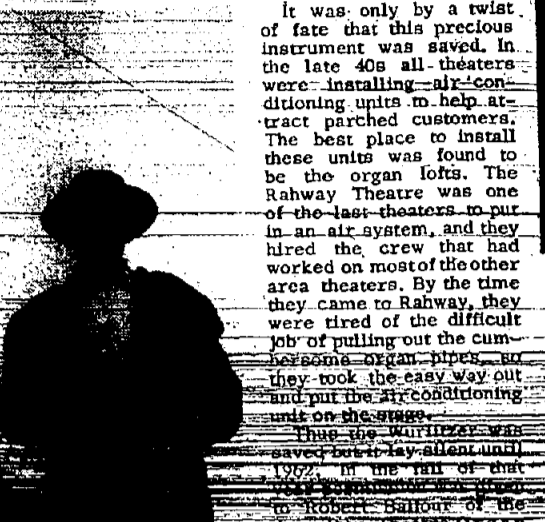

## Rahway theater cost \$1,000,000 to construct during late 1920s

On the night of October 10, 1928, Bremer and Pollock's million dollar Rahway theater opened its doors revealing an interior that was the last word in elegance.

On that particular evening the marquee was especially brilliant with its 2,500 flickering lights strung in the eaves of the building. A giant vertical sign which spelled out Rahway attracted the attention of the passing motorists. A giant vertical sign which spelled out Rahway attracted the attention of the passing motorists.



The 45-foot stage was the pride of the building. It was built on a concrete foundation and was raised 10 feet above the ground. The stage was equipped with a complete lighting system and a sound system. The theater was designed to seat 1,000 people and was one of the largest theaters in the country at the time.

It was only by a visit of fact that this precious instrument was saved. In the late 1940s all theaters were installing air conditioning units to help attract the best place to install these units was found to be the organ loft. The Rahway Theatre was one of the last theaters to put in an air system, and they hired the crew that worked on most of the other area theaters. By the time they came to Rahway, they were tired of the difficult job of pulling out the cumbersome organ. Finally, they took the easy way out and put the air conditioning unit in the organ loft.

New device said to prolong lives of roses by preventing wilting

Why do carnations and chrysanthemums last longer than roses? This is a mystery that has baffled horticultural researchers for years.

Dr. John Scallia, research professor in horticulture at Rutgers' Cook College, doesn't have all the answers, but he has found a way to extend the life of cut roses 10 to 14 days compared to the usual four or five days.

This advance from doom that every rose lover has been looking for comes from a chemical compound in a small piece of ribbon tubing. It's as simple as that.

"We've known for a long time that the problem is a blockage that prohibits the stem from taking up enough water for the bloom to survive after it is severed from the plant.

This tubing device placed on the end of the stem prevents this blockage. The material in the tube acts as a filter. We still can't explain why it works or why it only works on roses," he does," says Dr. Scallia.

Dr. Scallia feels his discovery was a lucky one. "We were using the tube on very small segments of the stem hoping to eliminate one of the many factors that cause blockage. After a month or so of running those tests we wondered what would happen if the tube was put on the whole stem."
