End of county government demanded of commission

A proposal to abolish county government was offered during the May 28 meeting of the Union County Board of Commissioners. The proposal was presented by Councilman George Cruz, who questioned the fiscal condition of the county. Cruz said the county agency has a deficit of \$1.2 million. He said the county is not self-sufficient and that the money is being borrowed from the state and federal government. Cruz also mentioned the inefficiency and fiscal responsibility on the county level.

Law would make bidders reveal political gifts

The Federation of New Jersey, in a resolution, demands that the state Legislature pass a law to make bidders reveal political gifts. The Federation is concerned about the influence of money in the political process. It says that bidders should be required to disclose any gifts or contributions that they receive from political organizations or individuals. This is to ensure that the bidding process is fair and transparent.

Gov. Ronald Reagan's proposed amendment, which would increase taxes on high-income earners, has caused a significant shift in Governor Byrne's position. Byrne's initial support for the amendment is now being questioned as he faces pressure from both sides. This shift in his stance is putting his credibility on the line.

Congressional report finds massive fraud in welfare systems

A report from a congressional subcommittee finds that there is a massive fraud in welfare systems across the country. The report, titled "Welfare Fraud: A Study in Mismanagement," details widespread abuse and mismanagement in the welfare system. It notes that billions of dollars have been lost due to fraud and inefficiency. The subcommittee calls for stronger oversight and reforms to prevent such losses in the future.
