

Council votes to construct new fire headquarters with four bays and keep Seminary Avenue building

The municipal council on Tuesday night approved construction of a new fire headquarters with four bays for equipment and storage. The ordinance is scheduled for adoption at a meeting of the council on Seminary Avenue.

The council also purchased a new American-made pumper for the fire department at a cost of \$24,700. The pumper is capable of delivering 1,500 gallons per minute.

Members of the governing body met at the city hall where there was no debate. Mayor Daniel L. Martin presided. Councilmen, fire chief George F. Linn and members of the public participated in the discussion which occupied a large part of the meeting. The session began at 8 p.m. on Monday and continued until 9:30 p.m. Tuesday.

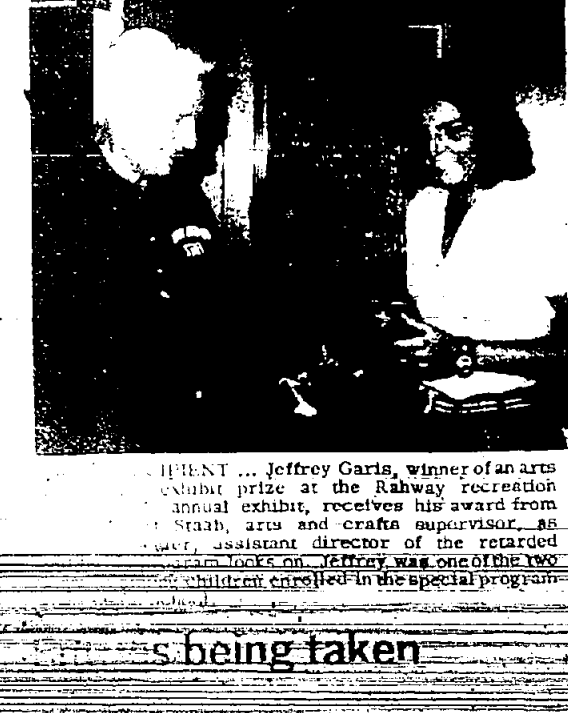
