Juvenile, justice is an area where I have long felt there was a great need for reform. Our traditional institutions for youngsters in trouble with the law have falled to change the behavior of those sentenced to the. In 1972 I was a member of a task force which studied new procedures for juvenile justice that have been established in Massachusetts. A new law created a category of young offenders known as "juveniles in need of supervision" (JINS) as opposed to juvenile delinquents.
