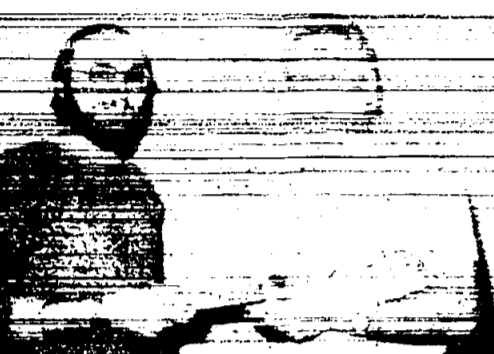

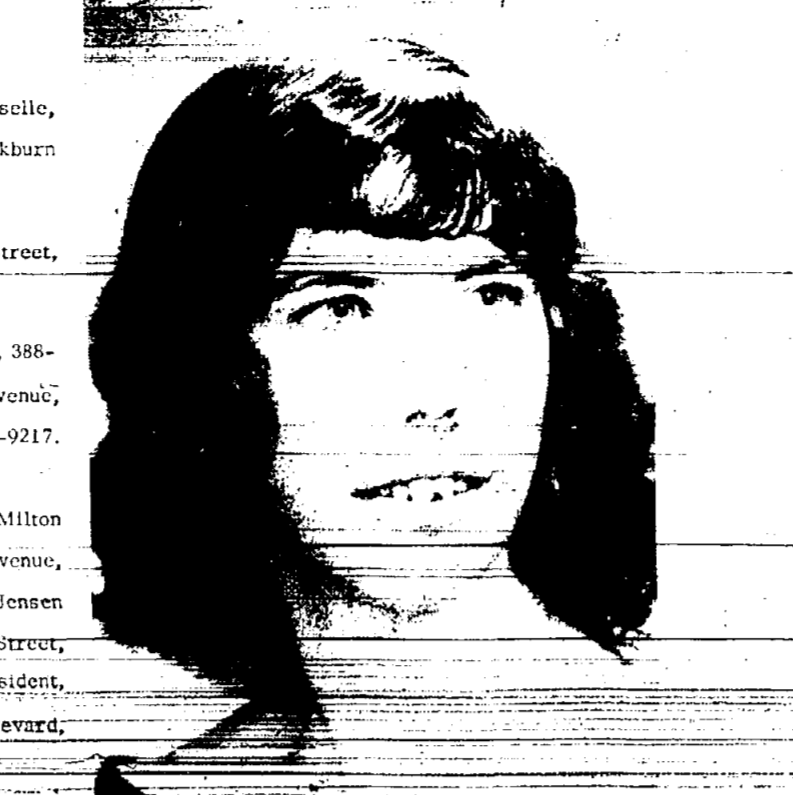

Rahway was on the scoreboard immediately as Debbie Dwyer, Pat Brennan and Kelli Givens made 5-0 runs in the first quarter. Kelli hit for eight straight points giving the Indians a 14-2 lead. Tough defense and good outside shooting gave the Rahway girls a 31-14 margin at halftime.

The highlight of the game came with one second rebound in the third period when senior forward LeCanda Kirby, made a layup shot that brought the crowd to its feet.

Kelli was the game's high scorer with 14 points. Leading scorers were LeCanda Kirby with 10 and Tracy Rogers with 10 and Angela with 8 points.

Rahway's ninth win came on February 9 when the team defeated Edison by a score of 44-17.
