Newark school serves students in engineering

The Newark Institute of Technology, located in Newark, was established in 1910 as the successor to Newark Technical School, which was founded in 1881 and was called Newark College of Engineering until 1975 when it received its present name.

A seven-member Board of Trustees is appointed by the governor to set the regulations for the administration of the college, and the mayor of Newark serves as ex-officio member.

The Institute is unique in the state because it is chartered as a city, rather than a state institution. This is a unique arrangement for governmental agencies. It requires special legislation to acquire state funds. In 1974 the Institute was authorized to develop the school of architecture, the first public architecture program in the state.

Chamber of Commerce will get \$100,000 for city revamp

A minimum of \$100,000 has been allocated to Rahway by the Union County Economic Development Corp. to revitalize business throughout the city.

Robert R. Markey, the president of the Rahway Chamber of Commerce, made the allocation Jan. 8 at a meeting in the city's new headquarters on Main St., Rahway.

Mr. Markey said he received a letter from the county executive director of the corporation, which is to be financed by funds available from Federal Small Business Administration improvement funds through the chamber.

"The Chamber's governing board will meet with officials of the corporation and discuss the responsibilities and powers. A report will be made to the membership at the February meeting."

The Chamber's president explained the \$100,000 would be doled out as a combination grant and loan. A recipient, he said, would receive 10% as a grant with the remainder as a loan over 25 years at interest slightly below the market rate.

"It will be up to the Chamber to establish the Chamber board of directors," he said, "where the money would be used and by whom." However, the corporation would be handling all the paper work, he added.

All that's needed," the city leader said, "is for someone to come forth and ask for money."

Mr. Markey and other members of the governing board were vague about the details of the SBA project but they said they felt the Chamber would probably have some input as to the size of an individual loan and the number of loans which are to be made.

Thomas K. Spear, the secretary of the group and executive director of the Union County Chamber of Commerce, noted the economic development corporation had earmarked certain areas of the county and so far had been successful in securing funds for those areas.

Mr. Markey noted any business in the city would be eligible for the funds, which would be limited to real estate improvement.

Although an initial \$100,000 is available, the chamber head said, more money could be obtained depending on the response by Rahway.

"If the program is successful in development of the city, it could continue the funds year after year. The corporation chose to channel the funds through a local agency which knows the pulse of the community."

The Union County agency has set aside \$1.5 million for revitalization programs during this year with both Rahway and Plainfield considered priority areas. If one of these municipalities requests the funds, the money would be given to another community not on the priority list.

In other action, the nine-month-old Chamber voted to officially become affiliated with the Eastern Union County Chamber of Commerce.

It was pointed out all aid received from the larger group over the month was granted. However, beginning this month, the Rahway group will pay the parent organization \$75 a month for all successful industrial services.
