Voters approve their own bills least often

The voter approval rate of constitutional amendments proposed by state legislatures or constitutional conventions is nearly double that of laws and constitutional amendments initiated by voters.

Findings in published studies completed after passage of the constitutional amendment initiative, Proposition 13, in California and subsequent upsurge in initiative and referendum questions in other states, reports a New Jersey Legislative Assembly spokesman, in the fourth of a series of the study.

Tabulations about the initiative use of initiative and referendum powers in 22 states, prepared by the Legislative Research Service of the Library of Congress were used by Dr. Anita Ramsey of the American Enterprise Institute in a book, "Referendum, a Comparative Study of Practice and Theory."

Ten of the 22 states with initiative powers are in the west, in the period between 1948 and 1978, seven states adopted initiative in North Dakota and 1978, the most frequent use of initiative powers was in Oregon with 119 measures voted in 1978, followed by North Dakota with 107, Washington with 73 and California with 69.

Most frequent use of the constitutional initiative was also in western states—California, 99; Oregon, 84; Colorado, 71; and Arizona, 46.

Total initiatives were: Oregon, 207; California, 157; North Dakota, 137; Colorado, 119; and Arizona, 117, over the period 1948 and 1978. In the 14 states which have both initiative and referendum powers, use of constitutional initiative has been

Area school systems work to detect strep throat symptoms

The Rahway and Clark school systems are working with Rahway Hospital in a special program to detect strep throat symptoms in their children, reports a hospital spokesman.

The ratification of the 1979-1980 and 1980-1981 salary guides for all school employees covered under the Rahway Education Association was approved by the city's Board of Education Monday.

According to Superintendent of Schools Frank Bernette, the contract amendments will extend for three years with average increases in staff salaries of 7.2% for the 1979-1980 school year and 7.5% for the following year.

Volunteers make tutor program work in city

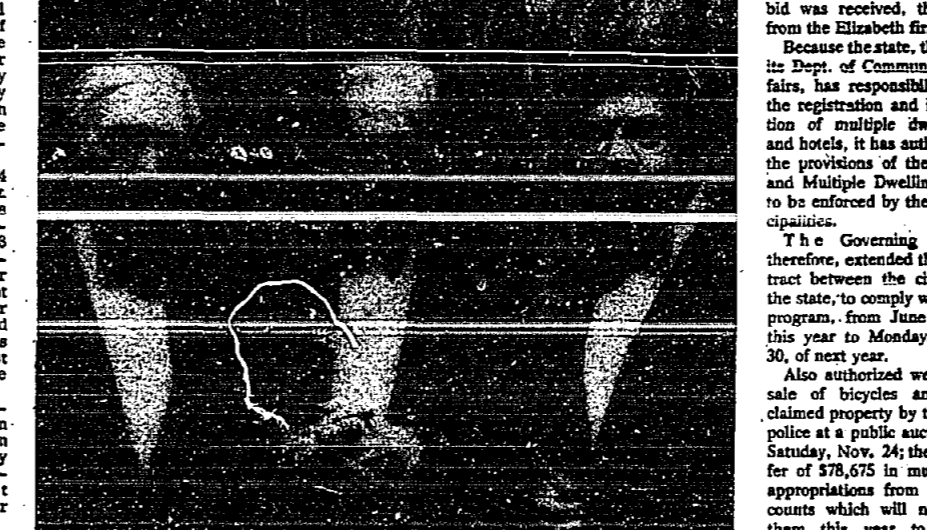
