Rep. Rinaldo sponsors 'Unity Day' on Iran

A resolution will be introduced by Rep. Matthew J. Rinaldo in Congress on Friday, Dec. 7, "Unity Day" in support of freedom-loving Americans held hostage in Iran.

"The flying of millions of American flags would send a message to Tehran and other people who condemn the actions of the Ayatollah Khomeini and the Iranian Revolutionary Council in the illegal seizure of the American hostages and personnel," Rep. Rinaldo said.

The resolution urges the President to issue a communique calling on the American people, businessmen, and government officials to prominently display the American flag as a public expression of unity in opposition to international terrorism and blackmail.

"No single event since the attack on Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941, has so outraged and unified the American people as the illegal seizure of American citizens and the United States embassy in Tehran," Rinaldo said.

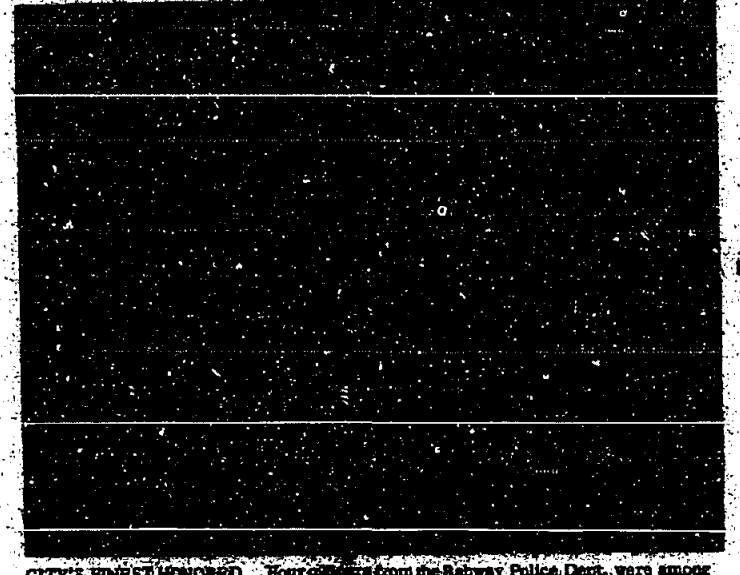

A policy which would require more intensive teacher evaluation and observation was adopted by the Rahway Board of Education on Nov. 19.

Teachers representative, Richard Carrozzini, who had objected to the policy at its introduction last month, asked copies of the policy be distributed to all teachers at the earliest possible time.

City Superintendent of Schools Frank Brunette replied all teachers would receive the copies as soon as possible.

Madison waves flag for safety

Federal programs cost localities too much

Local government is no more immune to the ravages of inflation than any other sector of American society. Faced with higher fuel and utility costs, increased insurance and health payments, and rising labor expenses, municipalities and states are finding it necessary to raise taxes to keep up with the cost of providing essential services.

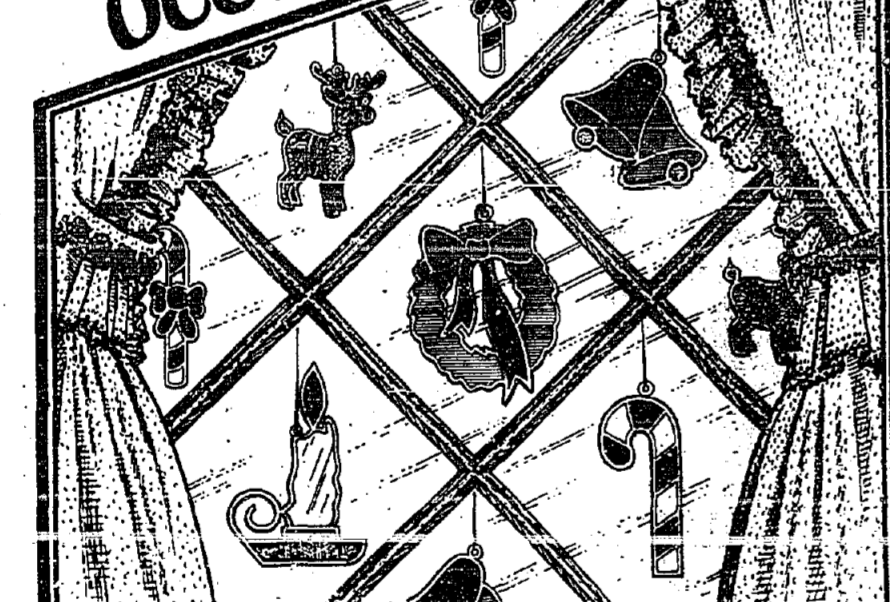
