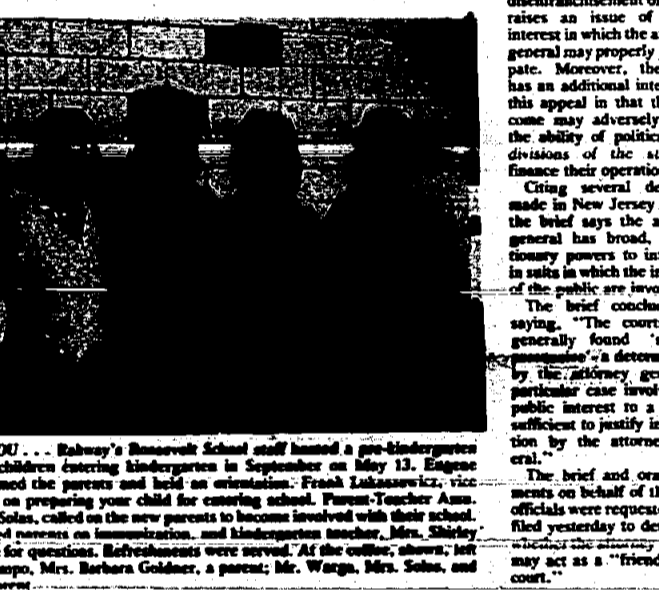

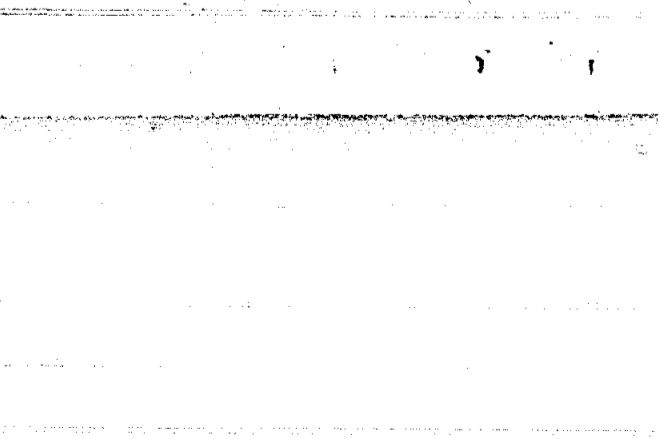

Select correct knit to insure proper fit

Determining the amount of stretch in a knit fabric is important in selecting a knit for a particular use. Before making a purchase, check the knit for its stretch. The knit should stretch 20% to 25% when pulled. The amount of stretch should correspond with the fabric's intended use.
