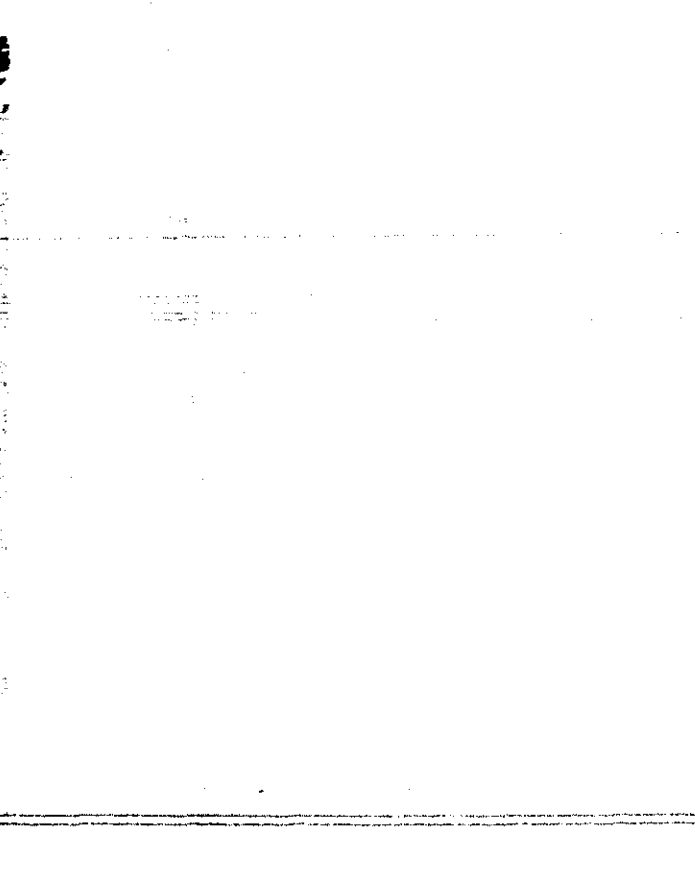

Sale of technology to Soviets didn't stop

The way the Patent Office now operates is so complicated that it is difficult to get a patent application on a new invention.

Statistics show in a recent five-year period U.S. patents were granted at an average annual rate of only 1.5%. By comparison, Japan's rate was 3.3%, West Germany's 3.1%, France's 2.1% and Great Britain's 2.5%.

Although the United Kingdom passed only a three-tenths of 1% rate, it is still one of the world's leading nations in the number of patents granted.

Investment and industry contribute significantly to the nation's ability to meet its production needs. The volume of patents granted to foreign nationals has increased steadily in recent years while those granted to Americans have declined.

When the administration passed an advertisement which states that the nation's ability to meet its production needs is being threatened by the sale of technology to the Soviet Union, it is not only a patriotic act, but also a necessary one.

After President James Earl Carter's "ban" on the sale of high-technology to the Soviet Union, the Patent Office has been asked to consider whether the department has been properly advised the patent law was more important than the economic damage to the Soviet Union.

It is the Patent Office's duty to grant patents to those who invent new things, and it is the duty of the government to protect the rights of those who invent.

Today's patent system would dim Edison

When Thomas Alva Edison was perfecting the electric light bulb and being his inventive genius produce a flow of technological advances in his New Jersey workshops, he had the satisfaction of knowing the patenting process was fast and efficient.

If he were alive today, the chances are Edison's ingenuity and creative spirit would be bogged down in a maze of bureaucracy.

The incentive system that helped to make America great is being eroded by a maze of red tape, and the Patent Office is being eroded by a maze of red tape.

A federal survey shows up to 28% of the patents filed each year are abandoned. This is a loss of \$1 billion in potential revenue.

In 1978 it took from two to nine months to obtain a patent. Today, it takes about two years. The Patent Office has been eroded by a maze of red tape.

Instead of inventing new procedures while budgeting Congress for more funds, the Patent Office should be moving to make their operations more self-supporting.

Fees charged for patents have been unchanged since 1945. At that time they covered 25% of the operating expenses. Because of inflation, they now represent only 20% of overhead costs.

Investment and industry using the Patent Office are expected to be more than willing to pay fees covering a larger share of the operating costs in return for good service.

Adding the fee to the cost of the patent is far preferable to a system where the Patent Office is expected to increase the present fees, there should be a fee-to-income ratio of Patent Office personnel, putting the agency on a more business-like footing. Requiring the Patent Office to be self-supporting is a more realistic way to achieve wonders in making the office more efficient.

Requiring self-supporting with efficient business systems can provide necessary improvements without burdening investment and industry with unnecessary additional costs. In fact, it may be possible to improve the overall operation while also making it more to the taxpayer.
