### Merck recovery plant draws fire in Linden

Representatives of Wilmer & Ernst, a European contractor firm that hopes to build a multi-million dollar recovery plant on Merck Co. Inc. site of Rahway property located in Linden, were questioned sharply at a public hearing July 24 by both council members and residents who are skeptical about the factory's benefit to the city.

While Kenneth Mayer, Linden Mayor, said the project would benefit the entire county by cutting garbage-dumping costs, Linden residents who attended the hearing were opposed to the proposal.

"Instead of being a good citizen, we may become the garbage city," shouted one resident. "Why should Linden become the dumping ground for Green County?"

"They say, the members of the Council, to put the people of Linden first before you decide to approve this plant," the man said.

The head of Linden's public works department, John Malar, said the proposed construction was not used as a chemical dump. He feared construction could "disturb" the area and create an environmental hazard.

"We don't need another Love Canal," Mr. Malar added. "Last Ward Councilman Mel Eckert said he too had heard the site had been a dumping ground. He asked if construction would endanger public safety.

"It was a dump site until 1953 years ago, but no chemicals were ever dumped there," Alan Sweeney, mayor of Green County, said.

Councilman Louis Roberts arrived in the financial aspect of the project. He wanted to know how much construction would pay to dump their trash at the site. He said Linden would be able to come up with cost estimates for at least two months.

A Wilmer & Ernst spokesman, Douglas Nichols, said his firm would be able to come up with cost estimates for at least two months.

"I'll be pleased, we can't give you an exact figure," said Mr. Nichols, who assured officials the firm would "complete" the site by adding the dumping fee to only one factor of the total cost of recovery necessary.
