Torrid weather signals possible food spoils

Food safety must be planned and followed. It is not enough to buy fresh food, it must be handled properly. The danger of food poisoning is a real one, and it can be avoided by following a few simple rules.

1. Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water before and after handling food.

2. Keep food at safe temperatures. Do not leave food out at room temperature for more than two hours.

3. Cook food thoroughly. Use a food thermometer to check the internal temperature of meat.

4. Refrigerate food promptly. Keep the refrigerator at 40 degrees Fahrenheit or below.

5. Avoid cross-contamination. Do not use the same cutting board for raw meat and vegetables.



Unflare those legs
to add pizzaz to pants

If your wardrobe of pants
is outdated by having flared
legs, it is easy to update
them to the straight-
legged pants fashion.
The first step is to measure
around the bottom of the
flared pants leg to know the
circumference. Then the
desired pants leg to be
made is measured. The
difference between the two
measurements is the amount
to be removed from each leg.
This can be applied to
10 to 12 inches. The difference
between the wide
circumference and the narrow
circumference will be
the amount to be removed
from each leg.
Next, iron down the old
legs and rip out the stitching
along both the inner and
the outer seam to the
crotch and hip area of the
pants. Divide the balance
to be removed by four because
the strip amount of
material will be cut off
amount at the bottom
of each seam.
Using a yardstick, align
each marking on the original
crotch and hip area, gradually
cutting out the excess
material. Mark the line and
begin to try and
check the pattern as
straight up and down the
inside leg and the
inside hip. If all is
correct, stitch the new
seams, press and re-
turn the pants — up —
down pants.
