Stinner sworn to Board seat of Roesch

The Rahway Board of Education member who replaced former Board member and president, William M. Roesch, on the school body was sworn into office at a special meeting of the Board on Aug. 25.

Fred G. Stinner, a former Board member who served two terms but was defeated in this year's school elections, was named to Mr. Roesch's seat after the latter resigned to accept two positions in the city school system.

In other action, the Board:

- Appointed Fred Stinner and Scott Lane assistant variety football coaches and Mr. Lane freshman wrestling coach.
- Appointed James Lashley head cross country coach.
- Hired Mrs. Deborah Sorenson as a science teacher at Rahway Junior High School at a salary of \$13,200 for 1960-1961.
- Awarded a contract to Carter's Van, Inc. to transport a handicapped city student to David Bradley Regional High School in Kenilworth from Sept. 1 to Monday, Sept. 15, at \$13.80 per day. The route is out to bed for the full year and is expected to be awarded at the Board's Sept. 15 meeting.
- Appointed Mrs. Louise Tavis as an aide at Rahway High School for \$12.25 per hour, and named three substitute teachers.
- Awarded contracts for 1960-1961 school supplies to 13 firms.

Land purchase moves mall closer to reality

The city's plan to convert the Cherry St. shopping district into a modern, family American-style mall came another step closer to reality Sept. 7 as City Council authorized the purchase of a small parcel of land on Main St.

City business, M&S Furniture at 1542 Main St., will be paid \$25,000 by Rahway for the 60-by-165-foot lot which the store uses for parking.

The store will still be able to use a small section of the parcel for three parking spaces.

Governing Body members, July 14 awarded a \$231,869 contract for the construction, which will also limit access to emergency vehicles and will include red brick colored crosswalks to Main St. of Rowland, Work has been underway for several weeks.

According to Mayor Daniel J. Moran, a combination of federal Community Development Grants and state financing will pay the entire cost of the project, expected to be completed before the end of this year.

Machine firm vice president challenges Councilman Marsh

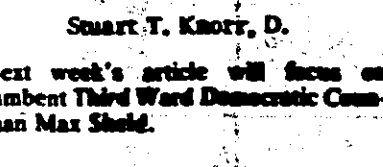

Flood control progress explained by Fulcomer

Rahway Councilman James J. Fulcomer reported an authorization for the Robinson Branch flood control project in the amount of \$12.5 million was passed by the United States House of Representatives and is pending consideration by the U. S. Senate Environment and Public Works Committee.

Councilman Fulcomer urged interested citizens to send letters to the U. S. Senate Environment and Public Works Committee, Washington, D. C., and New Jersey's two U. S. Senators, Harrison H. Williams and William Bradley, to urge Senate action on the bill before adjournment.

The Robinson Branch authorization is part of the Water Resources Conservation Act, which was approved by the national administration and the Robinson Branch Flood Control Act, which was approved by the Central New Jersey State Legislature.

To date, a total of \$172,000 has been spent for the preliminary stages of the Robinson Branch and the additional \$12.5 million is the estimated cost of the project, noted the Rahway councilman.

Only the feasibility study for the flood control project has been completed, he added.

Only after an authorization and appropriation of funds can the Corps of Engineers move through the general design stage, then proceed into the drawing of actual plans and specifications and finally begin the construction phase, Councilman Fulcomer explained.

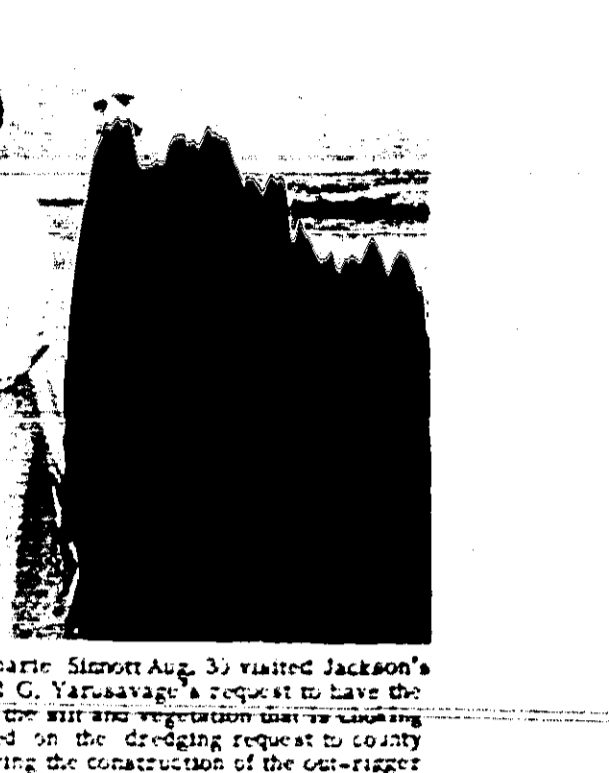

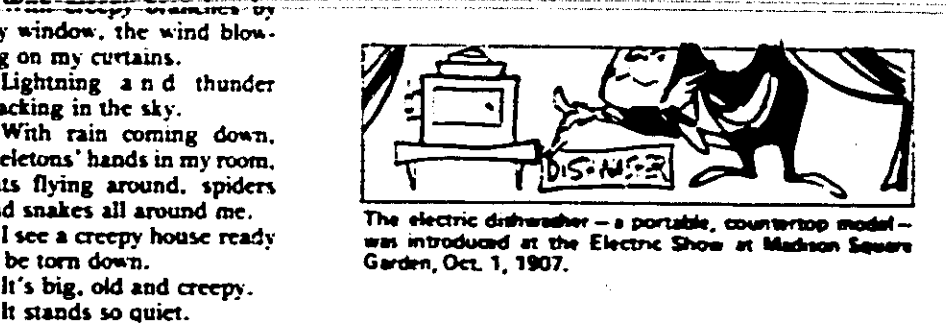

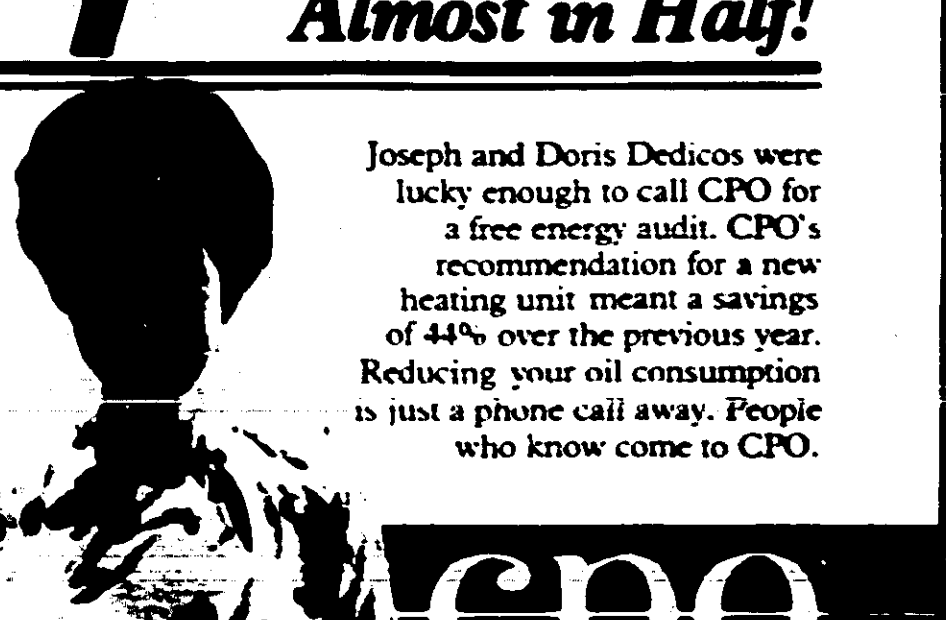
