## Democratic Assembly duel shapes up in Primary vote

Rahway voters find themselves included in a new legislative district, the 20th, with Elizabeth, Linden and Carteret, and controlled in a Tuesday, June 2, Democratic Primary Election fight.

While incumbent Democratic State Sen. John T. Gregorio of Linden is opposed for his party's nod, the Assembly race has three contenders, incumbents, Thomas J. Devenn of Carteret and Raymond J. Lesniak of Elizabeth, and newcomer, John N. Surmay, also of Elizabeth.

The Regular Democratic Organization of Union County endorsed both Sen. Gregorio and Assemblyman Devenn, but failed to back Assemblyman Lesniak, favoring Mr. Surmay.

Unopposed on the Republican side are Dr. John Fenck of Carteret, the Senate contender, and his Assembly runningmate, Freeholder Mrs. Blanche Banasak of Elizabeth and Rahway Sixth Ward Councilman James J. Fukomer.

As of May 1, Union County Clerk Walter G. Halpin's office had not been notified by the state of any independent candidates for the legislative posts.

While Halpin himself is unopposed, although they must file at the same time as Primary contenders, are automatically put on the ballot for the Tuesday, Nov. 3, General Election.

Mr. Halpin is unopposed on the Republican side for county clerk, as is June S. Fischer on the Democratic side.

Meanwhile, incumbent Republican Freeholder candidates, Mrs. Rose Marie Sinnott of Summit and Edward Skonkowski of Union, have been joined on the Republican ticket by Councilman Alan Augustine of Scotch Plains.

They are unopposed in the GOP Primary.

Incumbent Democratic Freeholder, Eugene Carmody, decided not to run again this year.

Running for freeholders on the Democratic ticket are Frank P. Beninato of Elizabeth, Mary Ann Doorn of Linden and Philip Postroy of Union.

Opposing them in the Primary will be a state of "Regular Union County Democrats" Abe Floom, Genevieve Zaparek and Luis Rodriguez, all of Elizabeth.

A third state, calling itself the Democratic Regular Organization, was forced to withdraw when Mr. Halpin said he found "several defects" in the petition of the three hopefuls on that line.

Two independent candidates also filed for freeholder seats.

They are Jerry L. Colaneri of Scotch Plains, former of Roselle Park, running under the slogan, "Freedom, Equality and Justice," and F. Richard Cerullo of Roselle Park, running under the slogan, "Conservation, Education and Taxation."

In the crowded field of gubernatorial contenders, Secretary of State Donald Lan, a Democrat, withdrew his name from contention, according to Mr. Halpin's office.

Among the other Democrats running is city resident, Rose Zeidweib Monrck.

The rest of the Democratic field is made up of Rep. Robert A. Rose of Wayne, Ann Klein of Morristown, Assemblywoman Barbara McConnell of Flemington, Sheila E. Mann of North Caldwell, Sen. William Hamilton of New Brunswick, Newark Mayor Kenneth A. Gibson, Jersey City Mayor Thomas F. X. Smith, former Attorney General John L. Degnan, Senate President Joseph P. Merlino, Rep. James J. Florio and former State Sen. Herbert Buchler.

Republican candidates are Richard McPhynn of Short Hill, John K. Kaffer of Hamilton, Joseph "Bo" Sullivan of Essex Fells, Sen. James Wallwork of Millburn, Assemblyman Anthony Imperiale of Newark, Senate minority leader, Barry T. Parker of Mount Holly, Former Assembly Speaker Thomas H. Keen of Livingston and Paterson Mayor Lawrence F. Kramer.

Another city resident, James A. Kolyer, 3rd, filed as an independent under the slogan, "Middle Class Candidate."

The other independents are Paul B. Ruzo of Trenton, Jasper C. Gould of Bernardsville, Bill Gahres of Barneget, Chester Grabowski of Clifton, Ernest D. Pellegrino of Weehawken, Julian Aaron of Haddon Heights and James Harris of Jersey City.

## Junior Olympics now to be Saturday

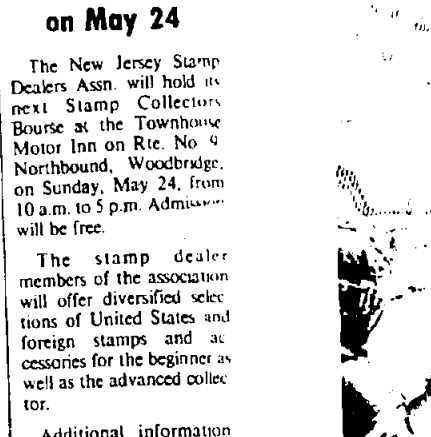
