



This end-of-the-year wrap-up meeting will be held in the conference room of the Administration Building on Schindler Rd., Clark, at 8 p.m.







There are four basic types: Hard lenses-This type has been available to consumers since the 1940's. Hard lenses are usually the least expensive. Special hard lenses which are designed to let oxygen pass through the lenses so the eye can "breathe provide greater comfort but are more expensive. Hard ienses require a break-in period to allow your eyes to become accustomed to them. Soft lenses-More expensive than hard lenses, sof lenses have the advantage of requiring no extended breakin period. Soft contact lenses are made from waterabsorbing plastic and were first introduced in the United States in 1964. Since soft contact lenses can actually correct only a limited range of vision problems, only six out of 10 contact lens wearers can use them. Since soft contact lenses can serve as a breeding ground for bacteria, which could result in eye infections, the lenses must be cleansed daily with special solutions, and then disinfected with chemicals or heat

Intraocular lenses-These are special lenses used by people who undergo cataract surgery. These permanent plastic lenses are substitutes for the natural eye lenses, which are surgically removed, Extended-wear soft contact lenses-These are also designed specifically for cataract patients. The lenses can be worn for up to one month without removal. A version
