The Rahway Rotary Club, which has been in existence in the city since 1925, will soon be going out of existence, reports Chip Smith, the president of the organization.

Although Mr. Smith said the number of original members of the club is not known, he added the present membership totals only 17.

The decrease in membership of his club in particular and of service club membership in this area in general was given by the president as the reason for the decision to disband.

There are no specific plans at this time as to when the actual dissolution of the club will take place, he noted.

That decision depends on the procedure to be set forth by Rotary International in Chicago, which has been contacted by Mr. Smith about the Rotary situation.

An answer is expected from the parent body in the next few weeks, he concluded.

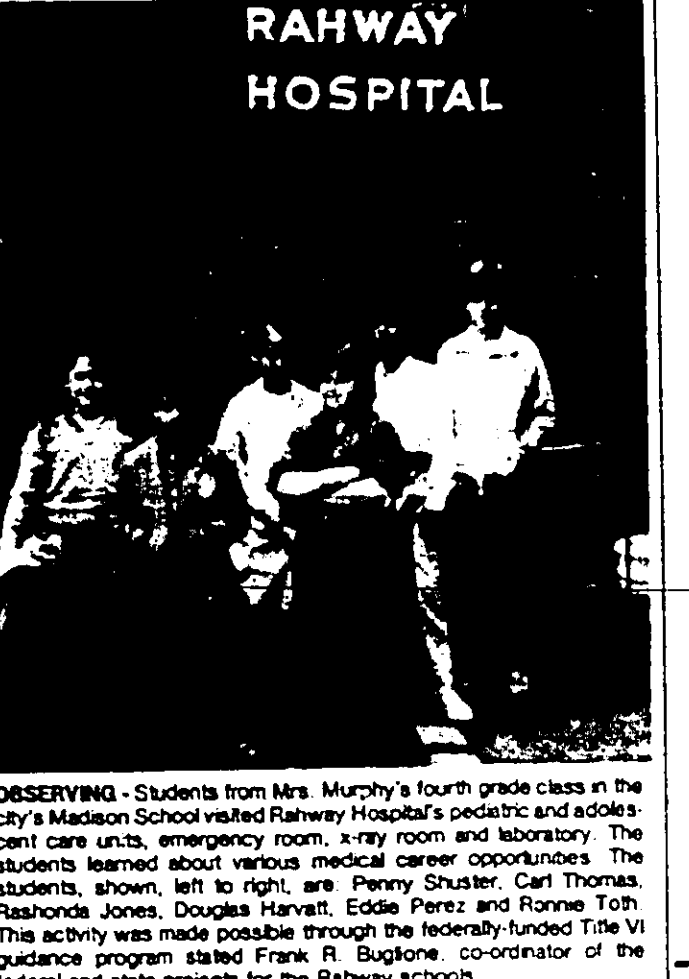

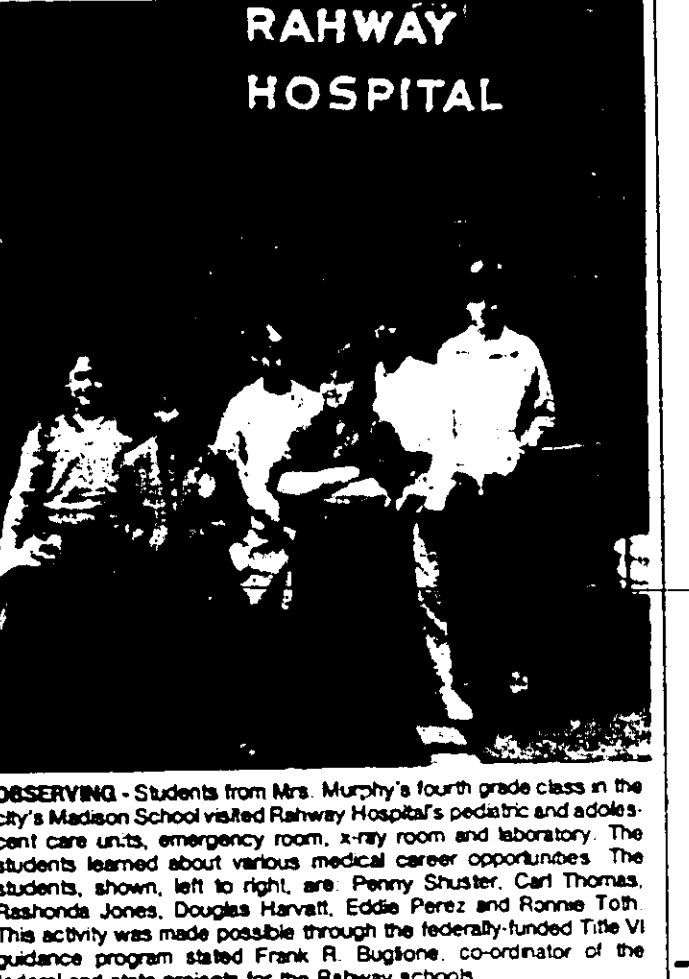

REPORT FROM WASHINGTON by Congressman Matt Rinaldo

The reestablishment of the Security and Terrorism Subcommittee in the Senate under the chairmanship of Sen. Jeremiah O'Rourke, a former prisoner of war in Vietnam, has alarmed some civil libertarians who remember the operations of the old US American Activities Committee.

It was the most controversial committee of Congress in the past half century as it delved into allegations of Communist infiltration into government, the film industry, the Army and the State Dept., including the Alger Hiss case of the late forties.

There is a difference in the mission of the newly named Security and Terrorism Subcommittee and the old committee.

An epidemic of international terrorism, kidnappings of American embassy personnel, threats of violence against world leaders, and the fear that small groups of terrorists may manufacture a small nuclear device are creating the need for better intelligence. A major purpose of the committee will be to examine the extent of the international terrorist threat and its implications for the United States.

There is a difference in the mission of the newly named Security and Terrorism Subcommittee and the old committee.

An epidemic of international terrorism, kidnappings of American embassy personnel, threats of violence against world leaders, and the fear that small groups of terrorists may manufacture a small nuclear device are creating the need for better intelligence. 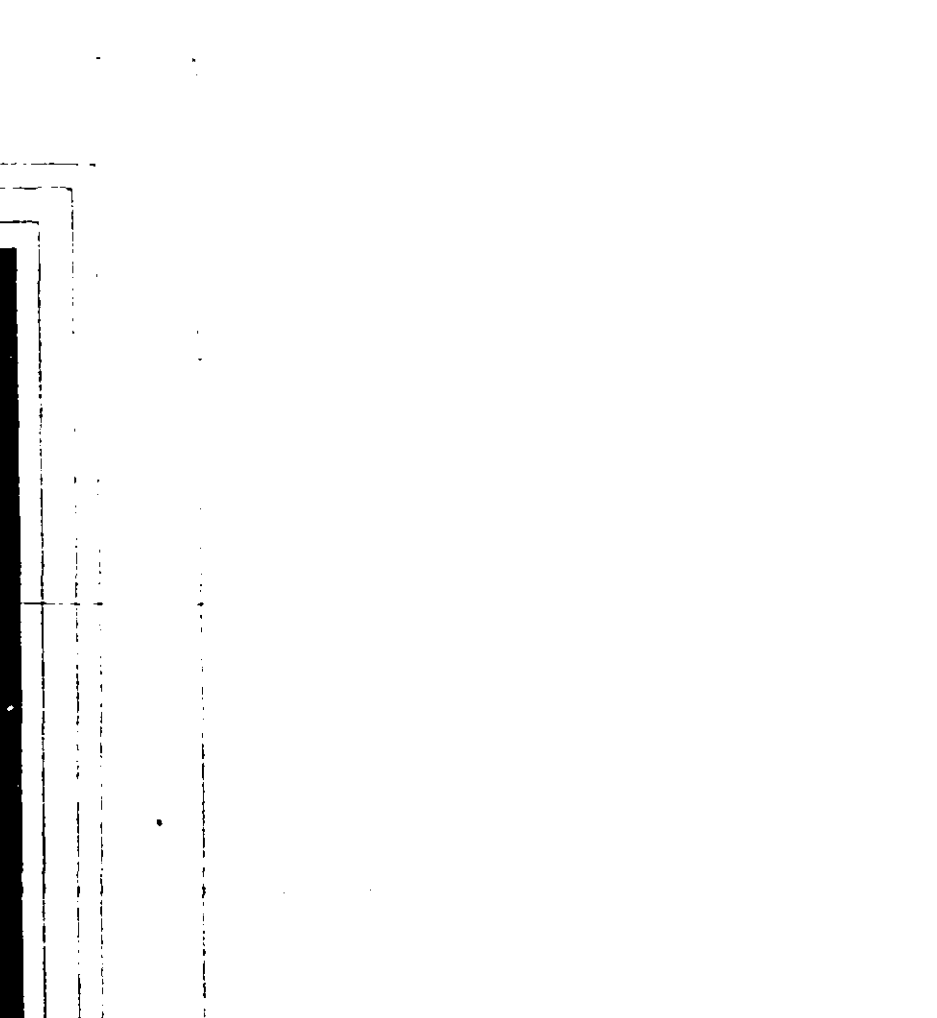

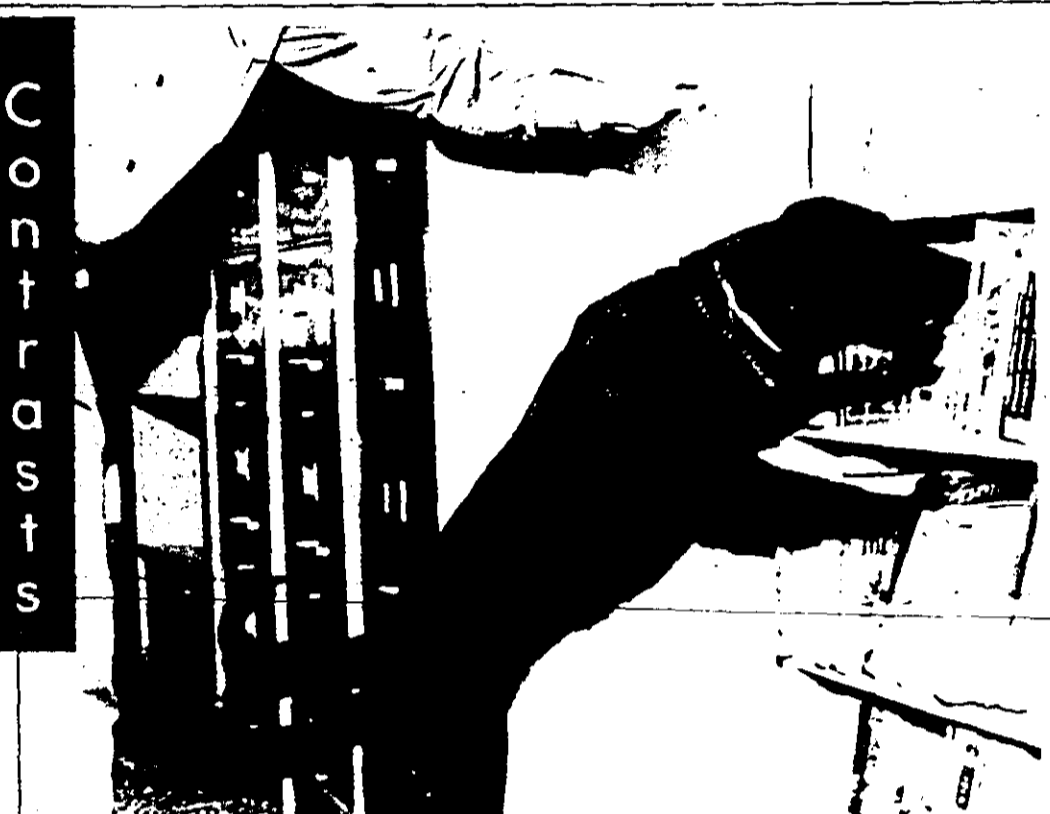

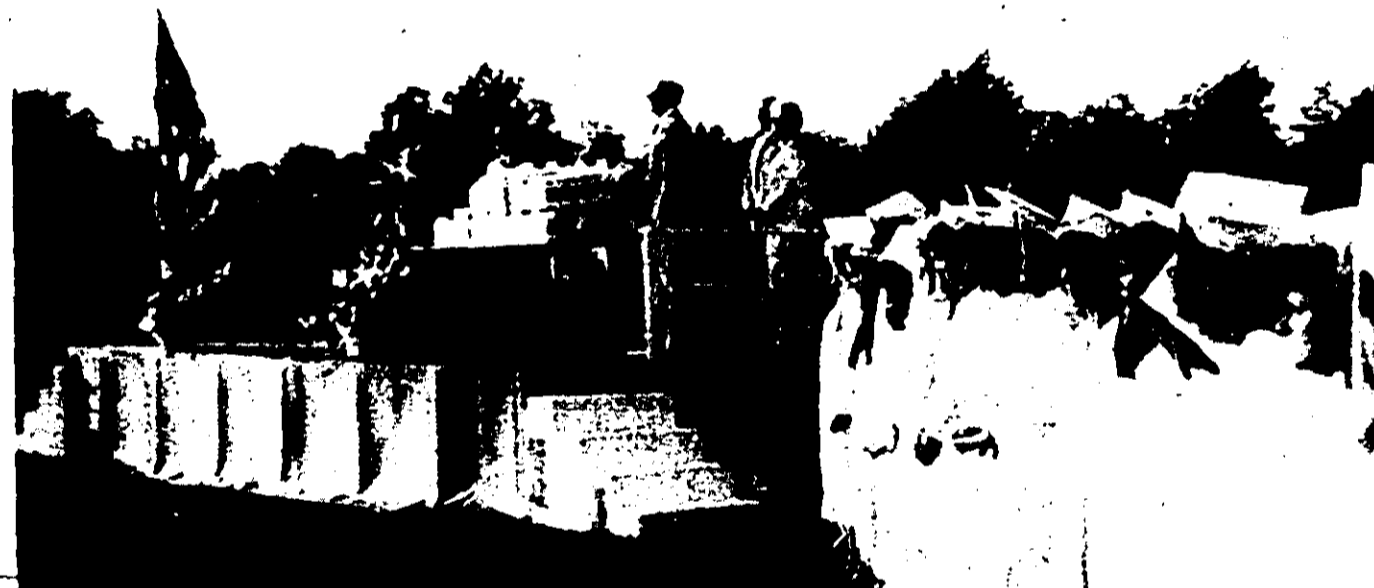
