At the Division of Consumer Affairs we get thousands of written complaints a year. It is surprising sometimes to see consumers have weakened their own cases because they have not stated them clearly, precisely and forcefully. There are a few basic rules all consumers should follow when it comes to complaining. First, go to the source of the problem. Your first

avenue of redress should not be a consumer affairs office on the local, county or state level. Rather, you should go first to the company, store or contractor with whom you are having the problem. Decide what it is you want in advance. Too often onsumers do a lot of complaining but fail to state clearly the remedy being sought. Complaining for the sake of complaining is a waste of time. Tell the company what vou want Gather sales slips, repair orders, cancelled checks or any other evidence that can help you support your case. Visit the business or person who sold the item or performed the service and explain the problem. If you get a negative response from your first contact

with the company, start climbing the ladder of respon-sibility at the company, eventually taking your complaint to the president or head of the firm. If you cannot resolve your complaint with the company, you should then turn to a government consumer protection agency for help. What should an effective letter of complaint con-The basic rule is to be as specific as possible. You should tell the story of your complaint in the order in which the events occurred. Directory. Letters of complaint written to specific persons isually are more effective than those written "to whom it may concern. When your letter of complaint has not prompted an acceptable response from the company, you may want to take your case to a government consumer protection agency.
