



## City's insurance broker changed after 13 years

By R. R. Faszczewski one councilman that Rahway should stay with the same insurance broker it has had for 13 years, the Citv Council voted 7-1 on Jan. 11 to award a contract to Marsh and McLennan. Inc. to provide insurance brokerage and consulting

Marsh, who said since the city has no "track record" with Marsh and McLennan it has no way of knowing whether all claims will be paid off efficiently, whereas it is aware of the track record of Boynton Brothers, its broker for 13



## Rahway Hospital leads in education in health

Assn. in 1979 challenged hospitals to move beyond their traditional role of providing health care and health-related education to broader arena of health promotion and disease preven-

The association felt a hospital should establish itself as the center of community health care, not just illness care, reports a spokeswoman for the Rahway Hospital.

Community hospitals across the nation have been taking a leading role in activities of this type since the mid-1970's, and 55% of all hospitals are now conducting health education programs for their communities, the spokeswoman add-

In 1975, the Rahway Hospital, anxious to meet the needs of the community, established a Community Health Education Committee under the direction
