Formal backing given to theater preservation

The group seeking to acquire the Old Rahway Theatre to make it into a county cultural center, Rahway Landmarks, Inc., June 16 was given the unanimous support of City Council.

It was pointed out in the resolution the theater was constructed in 1928 as a silent-film and vaudeville-presentation house, and has excellent acoustics, approximately 1,500 seats, a fly loft, a rehearsal hall, dressing rooms, a pipe organ and a large stage.

The councilman pointed out the non-profit corporation has started a fund-raising drive to acquire the city entertainment facility from its current owner and to begin renovation. They urged other private

and public groups to add their support to the drive also.

Two members of the group, Sharon Surber of Rahway, and Robert Balfour, one of the unit's founders, both thanked the Governing Body for its support.

However, Mr. Balfour said he hoped the councilmen would consider matching dollar-for-dollar what is collected by the group in its fund drive.

In other action, the Council:

—Introduced an amendment to the ordinance providing for an emergency alarm system, which would call for alarms to ring for 15 minutes or less rather than the one hour presently required. The attorney for the Governing Body, Charles

Brandt, advised most other municipalities have cut the time for store alarms to ring because of the impracticality of having alarms sound for one hour and because of noise complaints from neighbors.

—Passed on first reading an ordinance to appropriate \$300,000 to pay the cost of completion of the installation of new water mains in public streets and resurfacing of those streets where the city's water department has not completed the job after digging up the streets. Councilmen also said other utilities may be required to complete resurfacing in the city in the future when they dig up the streets.

—Introduced an ordinance which would authorize the mayor and city clerk to execute an agreement with Union County

which would provide \$630,600 in federal Community Development Funds for such activities in the city as the Rahway Comprehensive Housing Assistance Program, the improvement of Shotwell Field, the Rahway Senior Citizens Transportation Program, the Rahway Downtown Improvement Project and the Rahway Sewer-Separation Project.

The ordinances will be taken up for adoption after a public hearing on Monday, July 12.

The Council also lent its support to efforts currently

underway in Congress to extend the Voting Rights Act of 1965 to 1992.

Supporting the measure, John Robertson, the president of the Rahway Branch of the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People, told the councilmen the country could not afford to stop the advancement it had made in civil rights over the years.

Also adopted was a resolution authorizing the city clerk to meet with the editor of General Code Publishers to formulate and have printed the new codification of the city.

City pupils praised for high test scores

Rahway Superintendent of Schools, Frank D. Brunette, at the Board of Education's June 21 meeting, commended local students in grades three, six, nine and 11 "for achieving 90% or better above the state standard in six out of eight areas" on the Minimum Basic Skills Test.

He pointed especially to continual improvement in scores over the years by the students.

Mr. Brunette also noted in a press release the "school district exceeded its 1981 scores on the test, and the 1982 scores are the highest Rahway has ever achieved on the Minimum Basic Skills Test."

The superintendent revealed 97% of the third graders were at or above the state minimum requirement in reading, and 91% of them were at or above the state minimum in mathematics. Some 94% of the

year's sixth graders were at or above the state minimum in reading, and 95% were at or above the minimum in mathematics.

In the ninth grade 88% of the students were at or above the minimum in reading and 90% were at or above the minimum in mathematics.

The 11th-grade results revealed 91% of the 11th graders scored at or above the minimum in reading, and 84% scored at or above the minimum in mathematics.

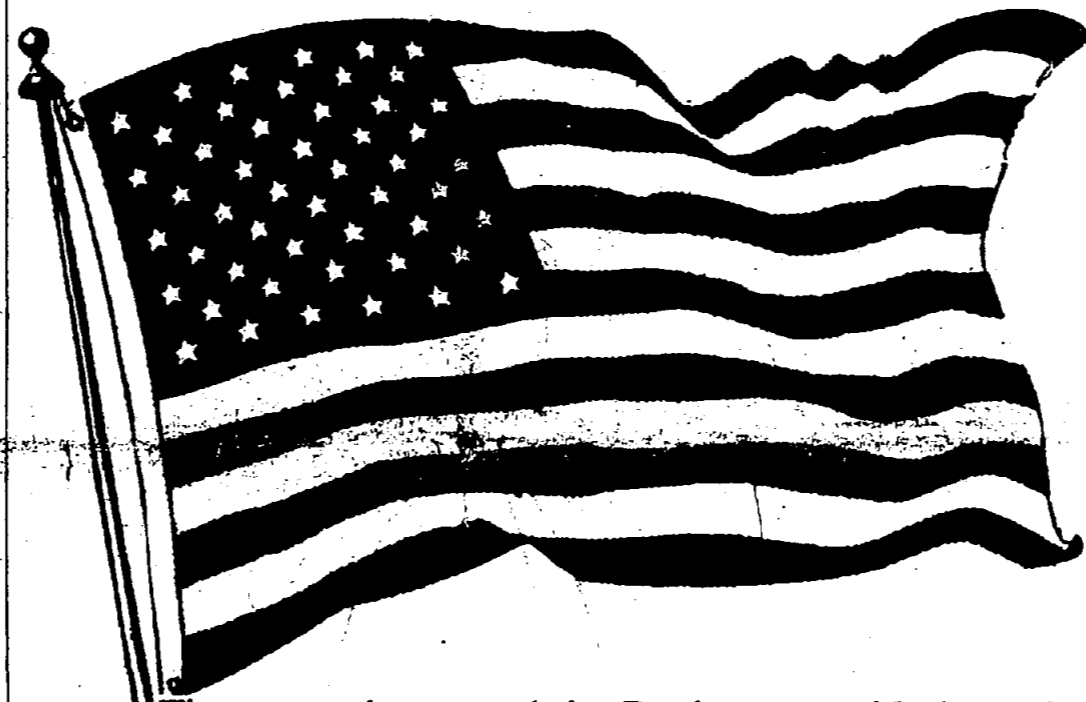
The Board made several presentations at the start of the meeting. Kathryn Hanson and Warren A. Hanson were recognized for their 24 years of service in the Rahway School System. Their retirement became effective on June 30.

Also, a former Board of Education member, James F. Cadigan, was presented with a plaque in appreciation for his service on the Board.

Finally, Mrs. Adele L. Magnolia was cited by the Board for her being chosen to receive the "Distinguished Service Award for the Advancement of the Profession" from the New Jersey Principals' and Supervisors' Assn. Mrs. Magnolia has served as a teacher and administrator for the last 27 years in the Rahway school system.

In other action, the Board approved a motion to reappoint Mrs. Josephine Lakata as the accounts-payable clerk in the Business Office as well as James G. Savage as an accountant in the Business Office for the 1982-1983 school year.

Two Board members, Barry Henderson and William Hoodzow, were opposed to the appointment of the accountant, citing recent cuts in teachers' posts.

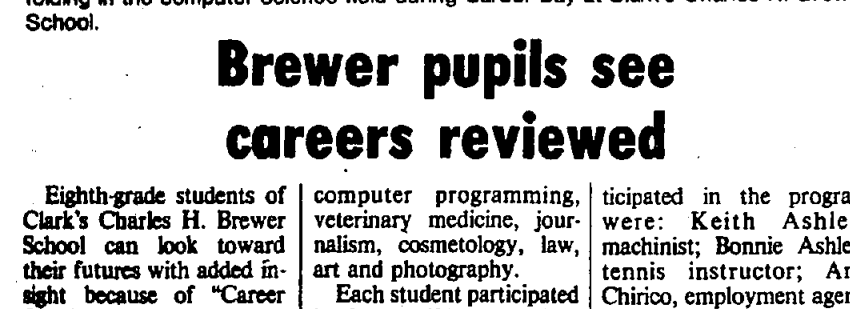

Archdiocese renews diaconate

The Archdiocese of Newark is again accepting candidates for training as deacons, effective today. The Permanent Diaconate Preparation Program was suspended four years ago pending intensive study, reports Archbishop Peter L. Grady.

Archbishop Grady's decision followed approval of new guidelines contained in a report, "Renewing the Vision," drafted by the Rev. Timothy J. Shugrue, director of the program, after a two-year examination of the new guidelines.

The acceptance of these procedures by Archbishop Grady and his auxiliary bishops came after their endorsement by an Ad Hoc Committee composed of priests, deacons, deacons' wives and families and laymen, chaired by the Rev. Msgr. Edward J. Ciuba, rector of Immaculate Conception Seminary and archdiocesan secretary for ministerial formation.

The program office will be located at Essex Catholic at 135 Glenwood Ave., East Orange. The administrative staff of the program, which currently includes two associate directors, Deacons, Walter J. Stanekki of Maplewood and Charles F. Kiley of Westfield, will be expanded, with the addition of persons responsible for the areas of spiritual development, field training and internship, liaison with wives and families of candidates and finance.

An advisory board is to be established, to review admissions, evaluation and professional review will be appointed. There are 217 permanent deacons presently assigned to parishes, institutions and agencies in the archdiocese. Most are married, and they devote an average of 10 hours a week to various ministries. They are among the most active and dedicated persons in the archdiocese between 1975 and 1981, one of the largest communities of Catholic deacons in the world.

The diaconate was restored as a permanent order in the Roman Catholic Church in 1968 by Pope Paul VI, following a recommendation by the Second Vatican Council. Training for the permanent diaconate in the Archdiocese of Newark was begun in 1973 with authorization of the late Archbishop Thomas A. Boland. Archbishop Grady ordained the first class of 77 Newark deacons in Dec. 1975.

The preparation program accepted new candidates annually between 1973 and 1977, when a one-year moratorium was imposed and a study conducted. Following a favorable evaluation of the Newark program by a team from the United States Bishops' Committee on the Permanent Diaconate, another class was accepted in 1978.

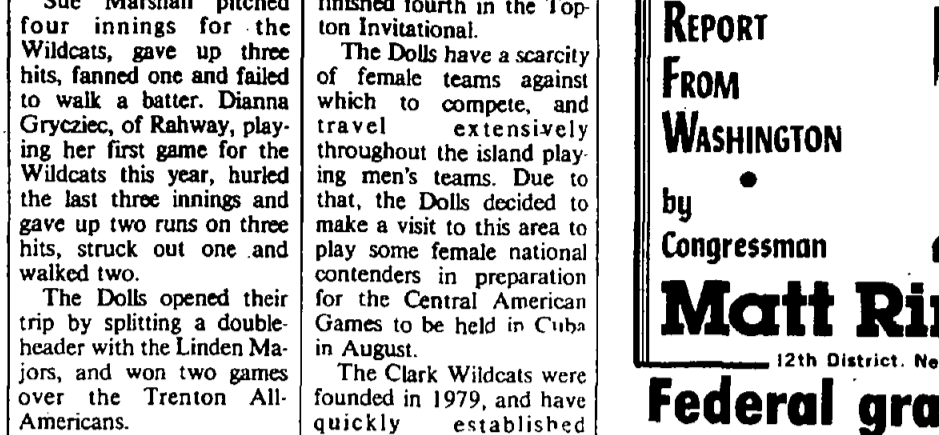
