New law to fight

for child support

Deadbeat parents who think they can skip out on hild support payments are in for a rude awakening under legislation recently approved by Congress and recently signed into law by the President.

The measure, which I strongly supported, will put he federal government on record as no longer tolerating a system that allows millions of women to be denied child pport payments to which they are legally entitled. The sad fact is compliance with court orders for child support in the United States is less than 50%. It is unilies with absent fathers receive regular child support payments, and when they do, the average is only \$40 s week. Census Bureau reports indicate children are being cheated out of \$4 billion a year because of unpaid child

This is a national disgrace that the legislation is intended to correct by strengthening correction procedures to make it more difficult for an individual to avoid making child support payments.

Among other things, the law will require states to:

 Begin withholding child support from the paycheck a parent who is more than 30 days delinquent once the at no payment has been received • Require employers to forward withheld wages to te appropriate state agency and be liable for any short-ill. In addition, either parent could request automatic

· Put in place procedures for imposing liens against real and personal property for past due child support.

• Make available to credit companies information about child support payments of \$1,000 or more that are

past due.

• Allow the deduction of delinquent payments from federal and state income tax refunds. This procedure would expire on Dec. 31, 1990.

Additionally, states will be required to expedite ad-

ministrative or judicial procedures to handle child support cases more quickly and efficiently. The legislation would further allow women to establish parentage and grounds for child support as long as 18 years after a child's birth. arentage is two or three years.
