### Marines promote Keith Vreeland

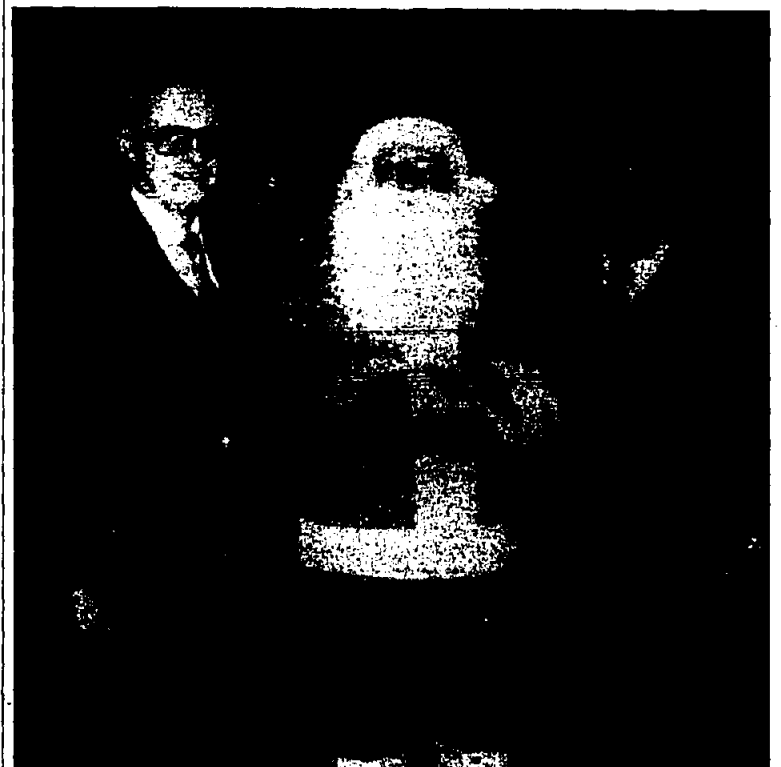

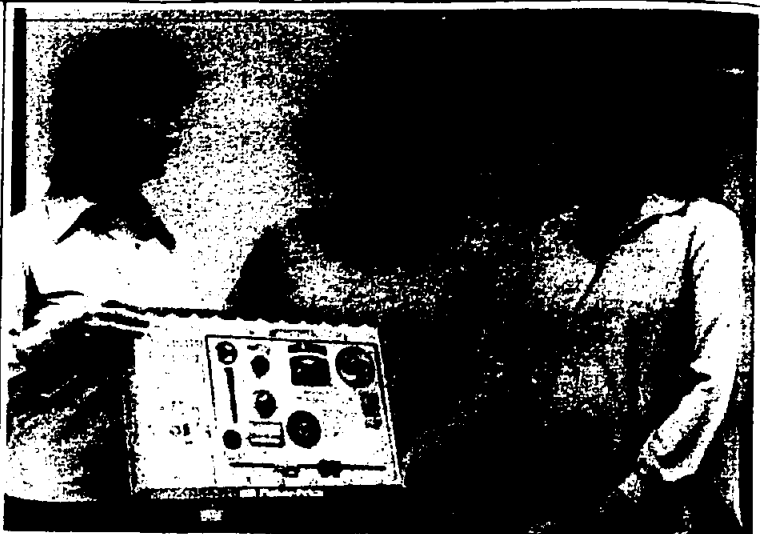

## Dentist gives moms tooth-care pointers

A pediatric dentist, Dr. Philip Gray, who is the staff dentist at Rahway Hospital, recently spoke to members of the hospital's Rockabye Club on the importance of taking care of their children's teeth. The Rockabye Club, a free club for expectant mothers in the hospital's service area, held its first session at the hospital on Dec. 1. Dr. Gray, one of the featured speakers for the program, pointed out dental disease affects 95 percent of the population and dentists move and more are stressing prevention as the key to a beautiful smile and straight teeth. Urging the mothers-to-be to start at birth, he recommended infants be encouraged to use pacifiers. "An infant has a frenum desire for sucking. Often, songsters have shown a fetus with a thumb in its mouth in utero. By giving your baby a pacifier, you will hopefully be able to prevent thumb sucking," he said. Dr. Gray showed the group slides of children whose mouths had become deformed from thumb sucking. He pointed out thumb sucking creates an opening in the child's mouth, with tongue thrusting being a major problem. A thumb sucker usually has an underdeveloped jaw from the pressure of the tongue against the lower jaw, according to the dentist. The speaker recounted a story of how a mother brought in her young child for treatment, and he noticed all the classic symptoms of a thumb sucker. The mother swore her child never sucked her thumb and this seemed to be borne out by an inspection of the thumb. He couldn't understand it until it came out that the child sucked her toe! This caused all the same problems. Dr. Gray recommended the Nuk pacifier which has an anatomical shape and fits the child's mouth perfectly. It comes in two sizes: Birth to 18 months, and 18 months to toddler. "If the infant does not like the Nuk," he said, "then try a regular pacifier. It is still better than letting the child get used to the thumb." Accidents are another area that can affect children's teeth, according to Dr. Gray. Toddlers are not uncommon for them to hit their teeth, he said. "If the teeth aren't loose or bleeding, then nothing has to be done. However, if a child complains, or the tooth is chipped or bleeding, see your dentist within 24 hours. Often a fracture can go right to the root, and this could lead to infection."

**CAR CARE CORNER**

**Stay In Touch With Your Brakes**

Before taking off on a trip in your car, always be alert to trouble in the braking system.

Strange noises from the wheels and uneven sensations in the brake pedal or a car's early warning signals.

Most noises are the result of wear. If brakes squeal when bringing the car to a halt, it could be due to glazing of the lining on brake pads or shoes. Glazed linings don't grab effectively and drums or discs can become damaged and scored.

A metallic grinding sound means that brake linings are worn down to the metal backing and the pressure of metal against metal is all that's stopping the car. This can damage drums or discs beyond repair.

If the pedal must be pumped before the brakes take hold or if the pedal sinks to the floor under steady pressure, there probably is air in the system or leakage in one of the hydraulic cylinders. The same symptoms can occur when the brake fluid level is low.

Brakes that pull to one side are another hazard.

A thorough brake inspection can stop problems before they occur, says the Car Care Council, which emphasizes that quality brake work is the car owner's best investment in safety.

**City handicapped get state school aid**

Rahway was among school districts in the state to receive part of approximately \$43 million in state and federal grants awarded by the New Jersey Dept. of Education to support a variety of programs for handicapped children.

Disburbed in three areas of special education for the 1984-1985 school year, the state and federal money will provide a variety of programs and services for handicapped children in New Jersey.

According to Jeffrey Owowski, director of the division of special education of the department, \$35 million was distributed to local public school districts for general special education programs.

"Among the programs supported were: Counseling, vocational preparation, secondary education, parent programs, computer assisted instruction and management and adaptive education programs," Mr. Owowski said.

Also allocated was \$355,000 in federal funds for pre-school resource centers serving handicapped children from ages three to five.

Mr. Owowski explained that 12 local school districts were selected to serve as the centers, which will provide consultation to pre-school staff, assistance to the family and activities to identify handicapped children.

Among high Clark point makers were Robin Kolvek with 11 and Chris Kowicz with four.

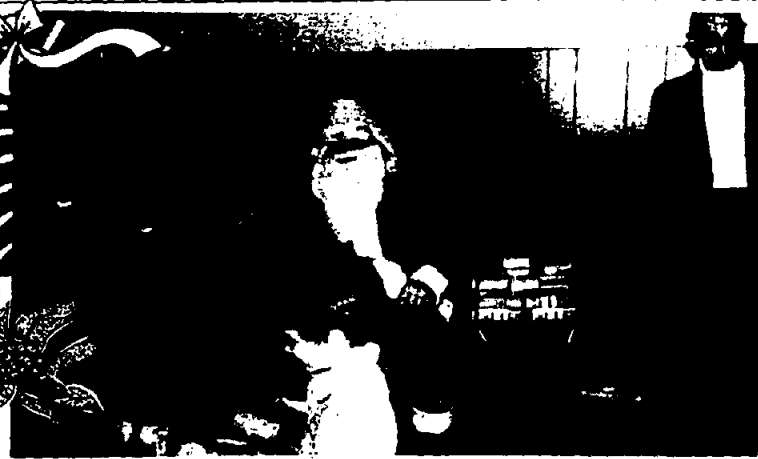
Clark led the edge from the floor 21-12, while the Bears were 11-8 from the line.
