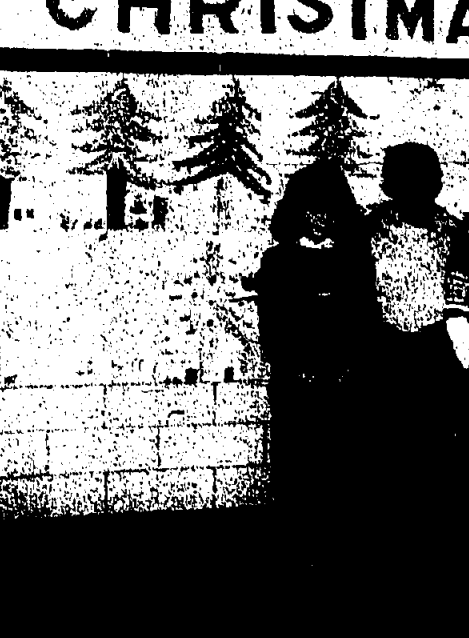
Council elects McLeod to head it

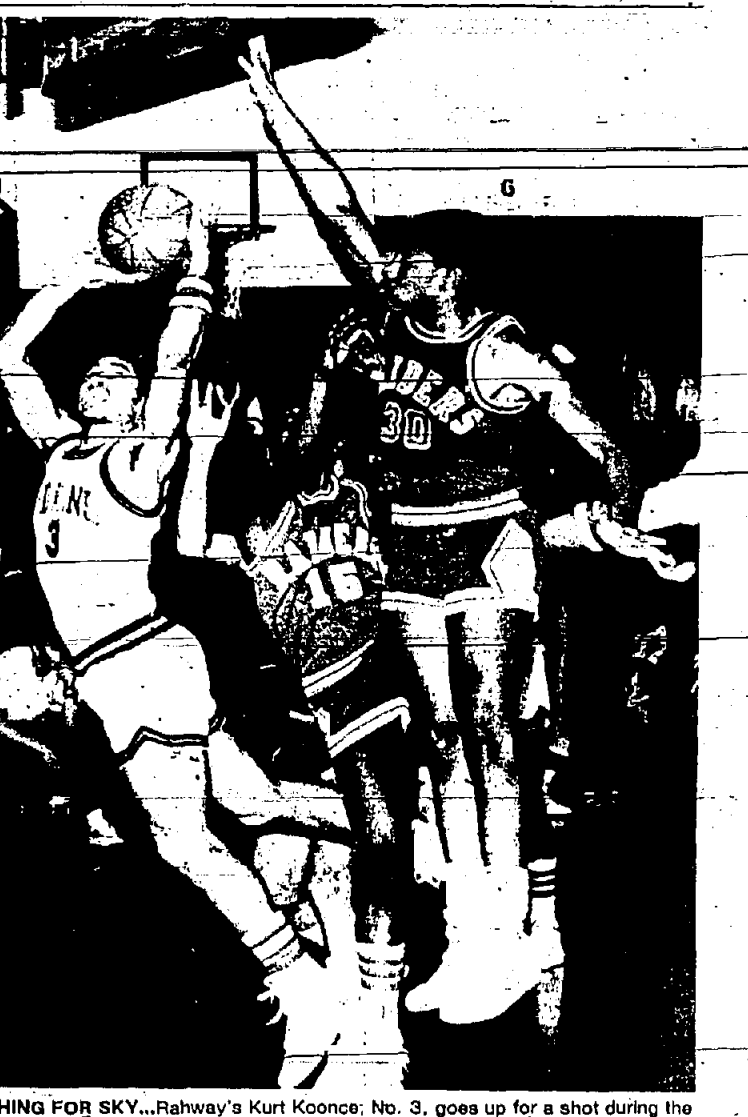

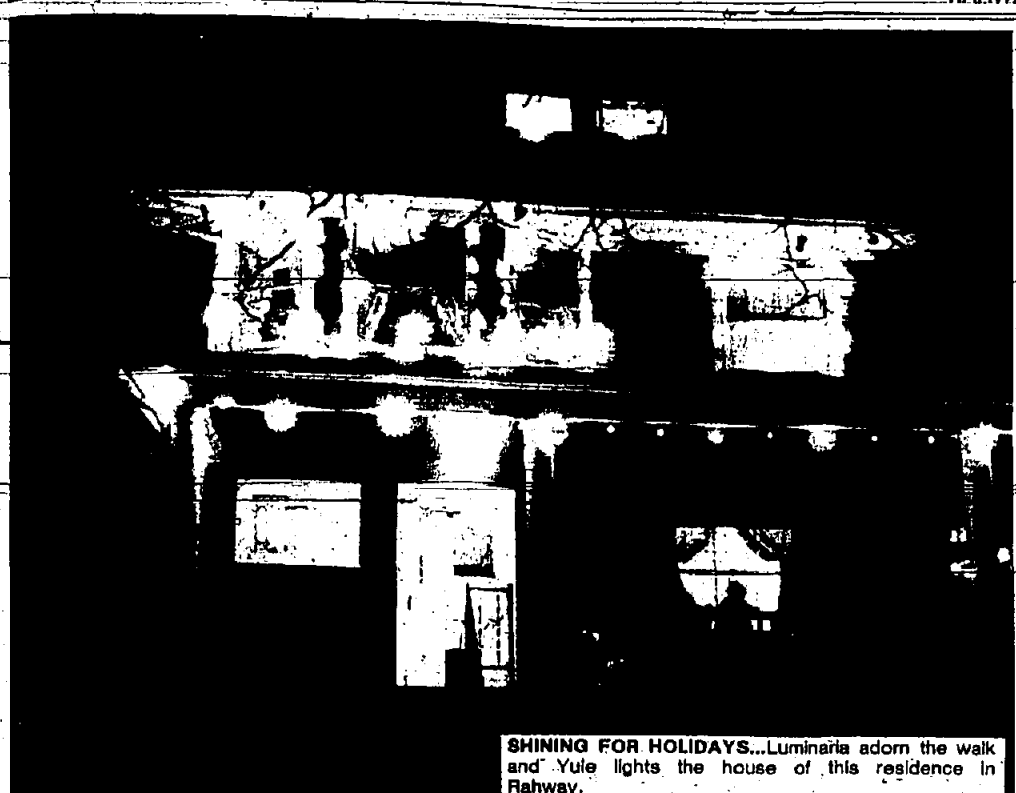

Birthday celebration to honor Dr. King

The final plans for a Martin Luther King, Jr. Birthday Celebration were announced by chairwoman, Lillian E. Hannibal of Rahway. This promises to be a fundraiser as well as a tribute to Dr. King, she said.

Mrs. Hannibal, an interpreter and exhibitor on the black experience, has arranged an audience-participation songfest and exhibit. The guest artist will be Vance Frazier, a baritone who recently performed in Carnegie Hall. The songs of sorrow, faith, hope and determination were, at one time, the only form of expression for black America, according to Mrs. Hannibal.

Also featured will be the choir of Blessed Sacrament Church, under the directorship of James Jones.

The president of the Rahway Branch of the National Assn. for the Advancement of Colored People, John Robertson, will conduct the audience through traditional-style singing of Dr. King's Civil Rights songs.

Following the Songfest the guests may go to the parish hall, where the exhibitor will have on display a pictorial review of Civil Rights in the United States with examples of Dr. King's impact prominently displayed. In addition African sculpture and artifacts will be on display. Members of the congregation, acting as hosts and hostesses, will be attired in traditional African clothing designed from authentic woven and dyed African cloth.

A free snack bar for browsers and a social hour have been planned. This will be a restoration fundraiser for the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection at 1064 E. Jersey St. Elizabeth. The affair will be on Saturday, Jan 12 from 4:30 to 8:30 p.m.

This year commemorates the bicentennial of the New Jersey Episcopal Diocese. Although the place where the diocese began was Christ Church in New Brunswick the Resurrection Church is part of the diocese.

The Church of the Resurrection came about through a merger combining the former predominantly white congregation of Christ Church with the former predominantly black congregation of St. Augustine's Church. It has survived the well-documented exodus and blight of the urban scene, reports Mrs. Hannibal.

The church draws its congregation members from Rahway, Roselle, Roselle Park, Union, Westfield, Cliffwood, Newark, Cranford and Linden as well as from Elizabeth. The dwindling congregation is in the second stage of a costly restoration drive. This fundraiser is intended to assist, she added.

Resurrection is one of the remaining Episcopal churches in Elizabeth. Its historical significance and its viable witness to urban concerns have been an asset to the community, according to the chairwoman.

She said it "has literally fed the hungry and cared for the children of working mothers as well as providing the spiritual leadership for the multi-racial congregation."
