Faszczewski The Rahway City Council. citing the joint participa Council and the administration on a committee to study the condition of Rahway High School, recommended \$3,919,000 in renovations the facility, Jan. 14 unanimously endorsed approval of the referendum on the project, to be conducted at a special Board of Education election on Tuesday.

In the resolution calling for approval of the referendum the mayor and councilmen called the condition of the school "extremely unsuitable for the children of the community," and added it "adversely affects the educational environment for the youth of our com-
