## Council unanimously backs school revamp

The Rahway City Council, citing the joint participation of members of City Council and the administration on a committee to study the condition of Rahway High School, which recommended \$3,919,000 in renovations to the facility, Jan. 14 unanimously endorsed approval of the referendum on the project, to be conducted at a special Board of Education election on Tuesday, Feb. 19.

In the resolution calling for approval of the referendum the mayor and councilmen called the condition of the school "extremely unsuitable for the children of the community," and added it "adversely affects the educational environment for the youth of our community."

They also said the state of the educational system directly affects local property values and other factors. The controversy surrounding the practice of apartheid, or racial segregation, in South Africa again came down to the local level on what, on the surface, appeared to be only a routine resolution awarding a bid for a 1985 Chevrolet S-10 Blazer for the department of public works.

First Ward Democratic Councilman Jerry L. Coleman, citing the fact all American automobile companies, including General Motors, which makes Chevrolet vehicles, had in-

vestments in South Africa, said he could not vote on the bid award because of that fact.

Fourth Ward Democratic Councilman Harvey Williams, while pointing out he agreed with the sentiments expressed by Councilman Coleman and noting he had been a major proponent of Council actions calling for a boycott of firms doing business with the city and with South Africa, said he would vote for the measure reluctantly because Barnes Chevrolet of Summit was the low bidder on the vehicle and under state law the Governing Body must award the bid to it.

He added all automobile firms, even those in Japan, Germany and England, have investments in South Africa, so there was no other place the Council could turn.

When the vote was taken on the measure the other eight councilmen voted for it and Councilman Coleman abstained. The councilmen also authorized the mayor and city clerk to enter into an agreement establishing the Union County Regional Environmental Health Commission.

Under the agreement those municipalities which join the commission will receive educational, experimental and programmatic help from the commission in providing environmental health services

called for by the state department of environmental protection.

The Governing Body also adopted two resolutions regarding New Jersey Transit police protection at the Rahway railroad station. The first, citing problems created for the Rahway Police Dept. when two New Jersey Transit trains stopped in Rahway late on New Year's Eve, 1984 and early in the morning of Jan. 1 of this year, calls on the state transit agency to provide police on all trains during New Year's Eve and during the morning hours of New Year's Day.

The second resolution, saying New Jersey Transit police protection at the Rahway station is inadequate at all times, calls on the transit agency to assign at least one of its policemen to the city station at all times.

Also adopted were resolutions objecting to the increase in the basic rate for Suburban Cablevision from \$8.50 to \$10, and opposing all future rate increases and requesting that all charges levied by cable-television franchise holders come under the jurisdiction of the state department of public utilities.

The Governing Body introduced an ordinance establishing no-passing zones on certain sections of Scott Ave. Also introduced was an ordinance designating the west-bound side of E.

Hazelwood Ave. near its intersection with Lawrence St. as a bus stop.

Both ordinances will come up for public hearing and possible final adoption on Monday, Feb. 11 at 8 p.m.

In order to have funds available to the city until taxes for 1985 come in the Council also approved a resolution providing for the issuance of a maximum of \$3,000,000 in tax-anticipation notes.

A contract, at the rate of \$175 for a half day and \$295 for a full day, for the use of a bulldozer and operator for the public works department was awarded to Friguletto Trucking & Excavating Co., Inc. of Rahway.

Specifications were sent out to five companies and only one bid was received. The councilmen also agreed to insert \$22,390.27 received from the state as

re-imbursement for Rahway's maintenance of street lights on state roads passing through the city as anticipated revenue in the 1985 municipal budget.

Re-appointed to a four-year term on the Board of Adjustment, until Saturday, Dec. 31, 1988, was Abe Reppen.

Also named were Donald Stewart of 763 E. Milton Ave. for the same four-year term as Mr. Reppen and William Hering of 1909 Church St. as an alternate member with a two-year term expiring on Wednesday, Dec. 31, 1986.

Mayor Daniel L. Martin's re-appointment of Mrs. Frances Erickson of 933 Lakeside Dr. to a term on the Local Assistance Board ending on Dec. 31, 1988 was confirmed.

Councilman William was named the Council's representative to the Union County Community

Development Committee with Councilman-at-Large Vincent Addona as his alternate.

Named as a constable for three years was William F. Schaffer, 3rd of 1250 Westfield Ave.

Councilman-at-Large James Cadigan was appointed the Governing Body's representative to the Planning Board for a term expiring on Tuesday, Dec. 31 of this year.

Appointed as the Governing Body's representative to the Local Assistance Board for a term expiring on Dec. 31 of this year was Councilman-at-Large and Council President Walter McLeod.

Third Ward Councilman Max Sheld was named a member of the board of directors of the Rahway Geriatric Center until Dec. 31.

## Board okays tentative \$14.9 million budget

A tentative budget for the 1985-1986 school year was approved Jan. 14 by a 4-2 vote of Board of Education members present at the special meeting.

The budget includes \$14,212,005 for current expense, \$452,800 for capital outlay and \$258,825 for debt service.

According to Board of Education Secretary/School Business Administrator Anthony Rocco, Jr., the current-expense figure represents a 4.9 percent boost from last year, capital outlay is up 35 percent and debt service is down 4.7 percent, while the overall budget is up 5.4 percent.

The amount to be raised by taxes in support of current expense will be \$9,305,497, that for capital outlay \$413,011 and that for debt service \$199,890.

If the above figures are adopted after the public hearing, tentatively scheduled for Monday, March 11, city voters will cast ballots during the Board election on Tuesday, April 2 on only the current expense and capital outlay tax figures.

Debt service is not voted on every year since the amount of debt to be bonded is voted on in one election and paid off over a number of years.

Mr. Rocco told The Rahway News-Record he cannot determine the tax effect on city homeowners because he has not received city and county budgetary figures yet.

Board members, Ronald Matusaitis and William Ulrich, voted against the tentative tab, while William Hoodzow, Bernard Miller, and Louis Rizzo were not present for the special session.

Saying he thought more work could be done on reducing the budget, Mr. Matusaitis estimated he could reduce the budget by \$475,000 without doing any harm to the educational process.

He added he wants to reduce the amount of vice principals, supervisors, clerical and custodial personnel included in the budget and said the system is overstaffed with teaching personnel.

The board member also saw no need to add another librarian to the staff.

He couldn't see why many of the things mentioned in the tab were needed in a school year in which the district is trying to have city voters approve a \$39 million project to renovate the high school.

Mr. Matusaitis noted the building renovation is desperately needed and to ask residents to approve too great a budget in addition to the renovation would be overburdening them.

Mr. Ulrich objected to a \$125,000 renovation of Veterans Memorial Field included in the proposed budget.

Although Board president, Rick Proctor, said the points raised by Mr. Matusaitis were valid he disagreed with the magnitude of the cuts recommended by his colleague.

The school body head added the tentative budget was adopted because it had to be submitted to county authorities by Jan. 15 and it is likely to be reduced before it reaches final adoption.

He also was optimistic the re-organization of the district to move the ninth grade, with its 270 students, from the junior high school

to the high school would result in a staff cut and a streamlining of the administrative budget.

A drop in enrollment has brought about the re-organization.

According to Mr. Rocco \$142,200 in current and capital expenses had been taken out of the proposed tab since the Board met to consider it on Jan. 10.

The reductions were reportedly accomplished by such things as salary cuts and capital reductions related to the re-organization plan.

Increased budget allocations will probably lead to improved library and computer science facilities, according to the Board secretary.

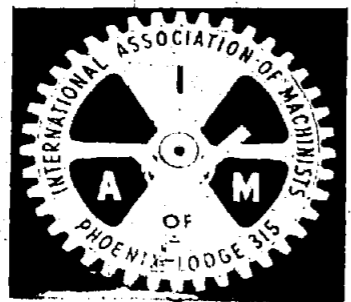
## Veterans plan for Memorial Day

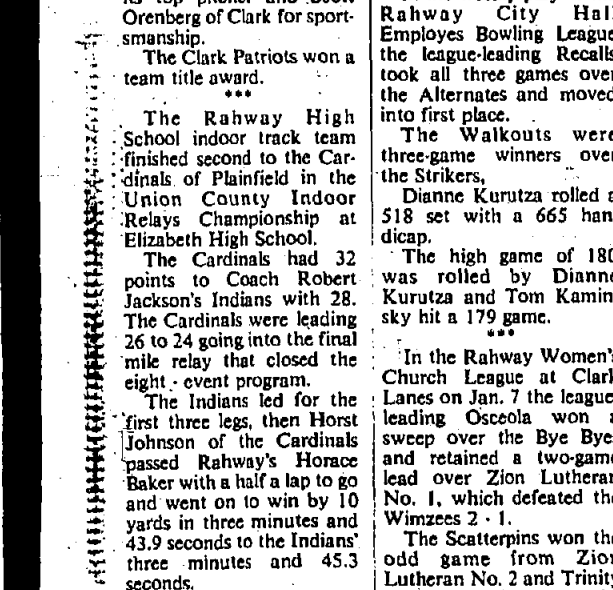

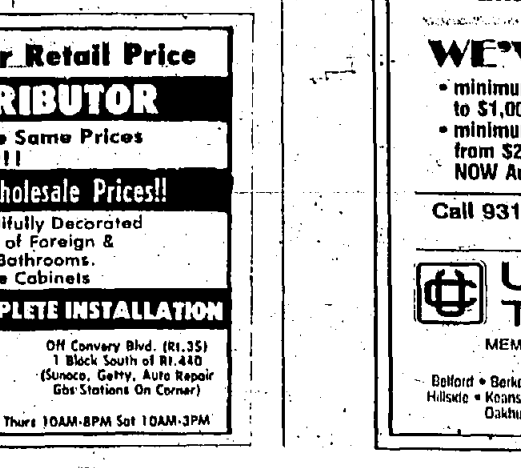

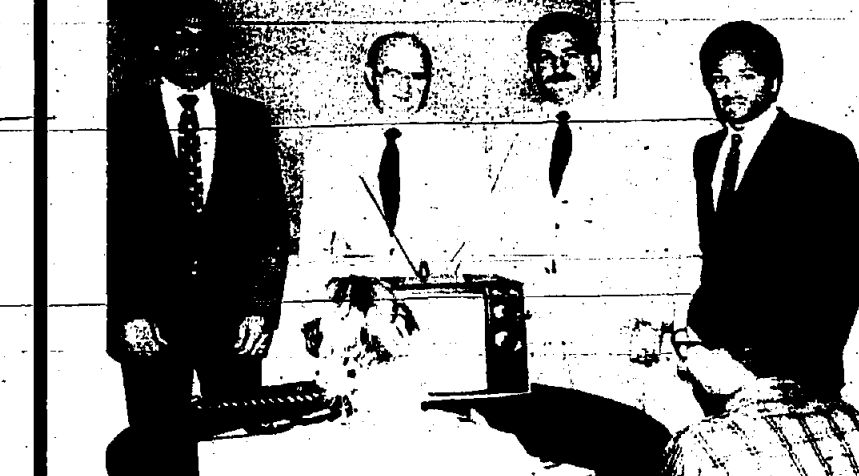
