islation and who represents Rahway, to get quick action on an odor problem which residents of an area near the Merck & Co. Inc. plant in Rahway say has been plaguing them for several years, and which they blame on what they believe to be substances being dumped into the sewer lines by the pharmaceutical firm.

An enraged Donald Stewart, a resident of 763 E. Milton Ave., said he has put up with the odor on and off about five years and is tired of having Merck and other officials try to blame it on a plumbing problem near his home.

Mr. Stewart added he has had his home inspected by plumbing officials and the odor, which eminates into his basement near a sewer trap, often when his children are there watching television, is definitely not a plumbing problem in his

Although Rahway Business Administrator Joseph Hartnett admitted the city had pursued the complaint from two fronts-that the odor could either be from something dumped in the sewer or from a nlumbing problem in one of the homes-last week health officials had decided it was definitely not from a plumbing problem.

Mr. Hartnett added the city health department has sent a letter to Merck informing the firm it is not a plumbing problem and Merck is expected to solve the odor problem in the sewer.

First Ward Councilman Jerry L. Coleman, who asked that the state agency be brought in, said Merck has been completely silent on Mr. Stewart's charges throughout the whole

ordeal. Councilman Coleman added the city shouldn't wait for an answer from Merck but should petition the state

for action immediately.

Another resident of the area, Walter King of 757 E. Milton Ave., said he believes the odor to be caused by a solvent which is used to wash out pipes in a plant such as Merck's.

Mr. King, saying if it is the solvent he believes it is, pointed out it could be a carcinogen and an ex-



O. Recently when my mother was a patient in the hospital, she was given a letter saying her Medicare benefits might not cover her stay. Receiving the letter upset her and I wondered why you gave it to her. A. We're very sorry the letter upset your mother and will explain why we gave it to her. As required by the federal government, the Metropolitan Peer Review Organization (MetPRO) reviews each Medicare admission after the patient has been discharged from the hospital to decide whether the admission and the services rendered were appropriate. If MetPRO denies Medicare coverage for the admission itself or specific days of care the hospital may bill the patient directly. The letter we gave your mother advised her of this possibility so it
