Survey favorable to resource recovery

Results of a survey of 132 Rahway residents who recently visited a Peckskill. N.Y., resource-recovery plant indicate a favorable reaction toward the

facility's overall operation.
"We are encouraged by public reaction to resource recovery," said Rahway Mayor Daniel L. Martin. "Residents saw first-hand the plant is environmentally safe, does not cause traffic problems and is a much better method of disposing of

landfilling." 6
According to Louis J.
Coletti, Union County er, the survey was conducted after three separate bus trips to the Peekskill plant, held April 24, May 2 and May 7.

Among those attending ore Rahway residents and both county and city of-ficials, including Edward J. Slomkowski and Brian Fahey, members of the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders. "Most respondents to the

survey felt the operation was clean, efficient and odorless," Mr. Coletti said. "We feel education as the the realities and misconcep

tions concerning resource recovery is vital to the public's understanding of the process. The facts and demonstrated experience show resource recovery is effective and safe way to ma."

Other results of the urvey show 89 percent of the respondents said they were not able to detect any plant odors upon arrival, other than in the tipping area, they never saw any of the garbage that was being processed. In a question about the volume of truck traffic at or near the facility, 91 percent described traffic being "medium"

Invitations to participate n the series of tours were mailed to over 800 city residents who, in a survey conducted by Rahway last year, expressed an interest in visiting a resource --recovery facility. The buses were filled on a first-come/first-served basis.
