20th District Assembly race highlights Primary

The major contests of local interest in Tuesday's Primary Elections, at least for Rahway voters, will be the races for Assembly in the 20th District, in which there are opposition slates in both major parties for the first time in recent memory. On the Democratic side the organization candidates, incumbent, Thomas J. Deverin of Carteret, and his runningmate, Linden Mayor George Hudak, will be facing Rahway First Ward Councilman Jerry L. Coleman and Frank P. Beninato, Jr. of Elizabeth. Incumbent Democrat, Thomas Long of Linden, decided not to seek another term.

GOP organization candidate, Alice B. Holzapfel of Elizabeth and Michael A. Posnock of Linden, will be facing two Elizabeth men, Guido Esposito and Paul Bregman.

Six Democrats will be seeking the chance to run against incumbent Republican Gov. Thomas H. Kean, who is unopposed for his party's nod.

They are: Former State Sen. Stephen B. Wiley of Convent Station, State Sen. John E. Russo of Toms River, Essex County Executive Peter Shapiro of South Orange, Elliot Greenspan of Bloomfield, Newark Mayor Kenneth Gibson and former United States Attorney Robert J. DeTuro of Morrisdim.

The only other contests in the Primary will be in the Democratic race for freeholder, in which incumbents, Charlotte DeFilippo of Hillside and Walter Boright of Scotch Plains, and their runningmate on the organization line, Gerald W. McCann of

Elizabeth, will be facing an all-Plainfield slate composed of Rowand Clark, Marjorie Peterson and Daniel McGowan, and a Roselle man, Elie-Ernest.

The winners of the Democratic nomination will face Republican nominees, G. Richard Malgran of Plainfield, the only GOP incumbent; William H. Eldridge of Summit, the former mayor of Berkeley Heights, and Rahway Sixth Ward Councilman James J. Fulcomer.

Unopposed for four-year terms on the Republican State Committee are Richard P. Hatfield of Scotch Plains, the former Union County register, and Elizabeth Republican chairwoman, Blanche Banasiak, a former freeholder.

The Democratic nominees for four-year terms on their party's state committee, all unopposed, are: June S. Fischer of Scotch Plains, Union County Register Joanne Rajoppl of Springfield and Reni Erdos of Summit, on the female side, and Frederic S. Kessler of Cranford, Fred W. Lester of Hillside and Elizabeth Fourth Ward Councilman John McKenna.

In addition to choosing nominees for governor, assemblyman, freeholder and members of their respective state committees Rahway Republicans and Democrats will be selecting a male and female member of their respective local county party committees from each of the city's 24 election districts.

All county committee candidates this year in the city are running on the respective parties' organization lines.

However, 18 vacancies on the Rahway Democratic Committee will have to be filled either by write-in candidates in the primary or at the Democratic Party's city re-organization meeting, which will be held one week after the Primary.

There were no petitions filed to run for the Democratic Committee in

the Fourth District of the Second Ward, in the First District of the Third Ward, in the Fourth District of the Fourth Ward, in the First District of the Fifth Ward, in the Third District of the Fifth Ward and in the entire Sixth Ward.

Rahway has over 14,500 registered voters. If you wish to vote on Tuesday it

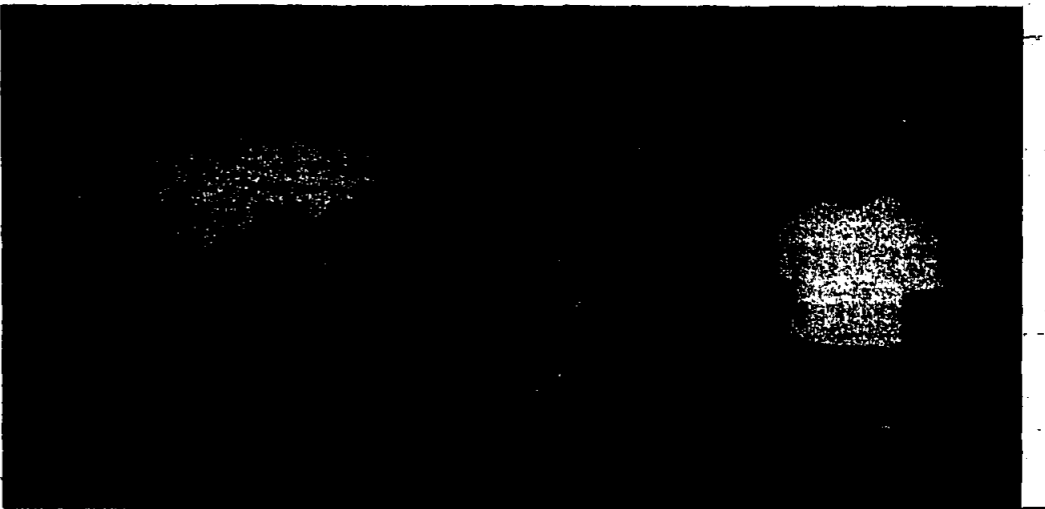
is good to know which election district you are in and where you should cast your ballot.

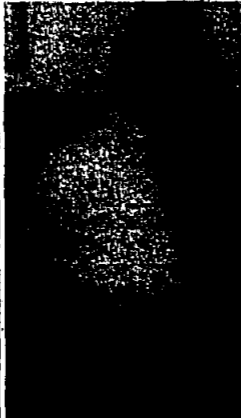

Survey favorable to resource recovery

Results of a survey of 132 Rahway residents who recently visited a Peekskill, N.Y., resource-recovery plant indicate a favorable reaction toward the facility's overall operation.

"We are encouraged by public reaction to resource recovery," said Rahway Mayor Daniel L. Martin.

"Residents saw first-hand the plant is environmentally safe, does not cause traffic problems and is a much better method of disposing of solid waste than landfilling."

According to Louis J. Coletti, Union County manager, the survey was conducted after three separate bus trips to the Peekskill plant, held April 24, May 2 and May 7.

Among those attending were Rahway residents and both county and city officials, including Edward J. Slomkowski and Brian Fahey, members of the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

Other results of the survey show 89 percent of the respondents said they were not able to detect any plant odors upon arrival, and 93 percent indicated, other than in the tipping area, they never saw any of the garbage that was being processed. In a question about the volume of truck traffic at or near the facility, 91 percent described traffic as being "medium" or "light."

Invitations to participate in the series of tours were mailed to over 800 city residents who, in a survey conducted by Rahway last year, expressed an interest in visiting a resource-recovery facility. The buses were filled on a first-come/first-served basis.

"We were impressed with the number of citizens in-

terested in visiting a state-of-the-art resource recovery facility," said Joseph Hartnett, business administrator of Rahway. "It indicates very clearly Rahway residents take pride in the future of their community."

In a space on the survey reserved for questions and comments residents indicated that they would like more information about environmental impact, truck traffic and financial benefits for the city.

Others who attended said they were favorably impressed with the Peekskill plant and would be proud to have a resource-recovery facility in their city.

One resident, who is aware of the imminent garbage disposal crisis, expressed an attitude held by many when he wrote, "Why are we procrastinating? This is a must!"

Union County, which has been negotiating to have a resource-recovery plant built in Rahway, has identified six firms qualified to construct and operate the facility and is currently seeking estimates from those companies.

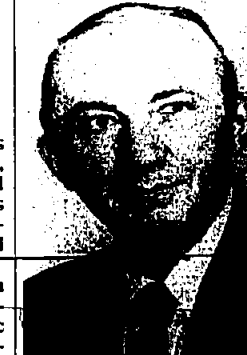

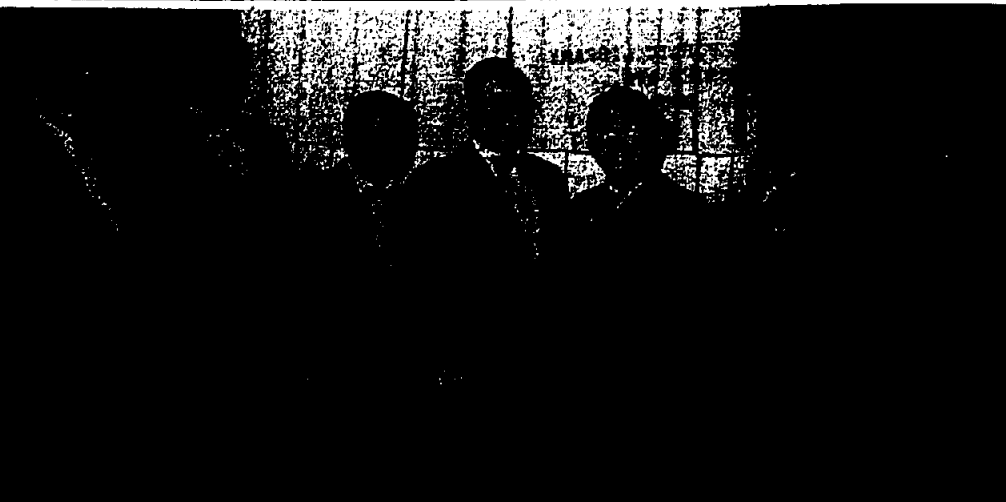

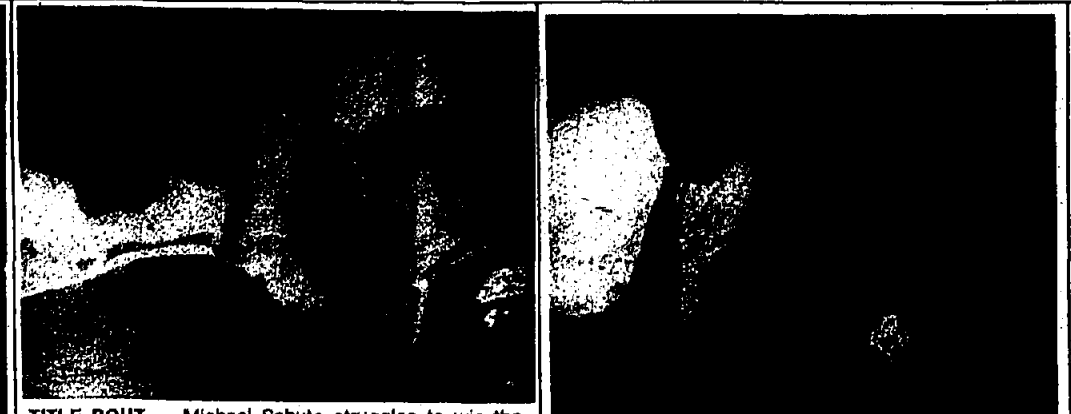

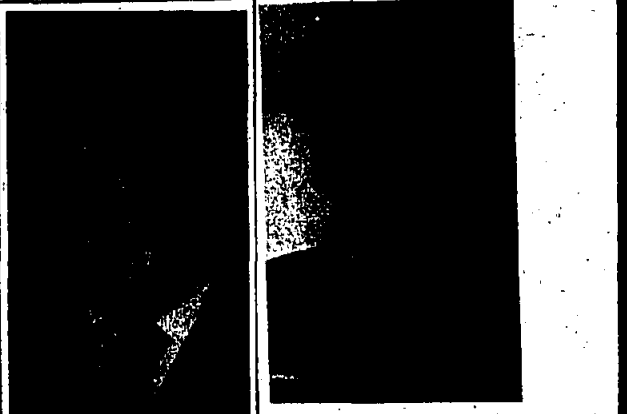

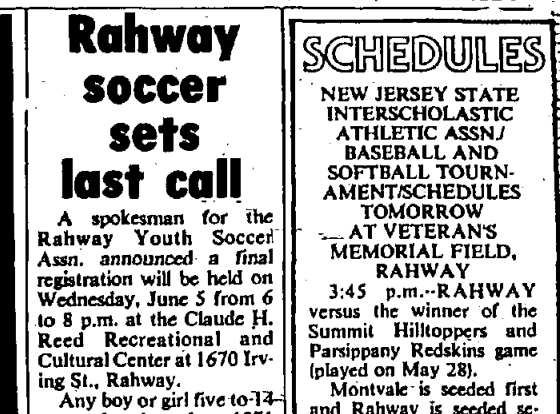

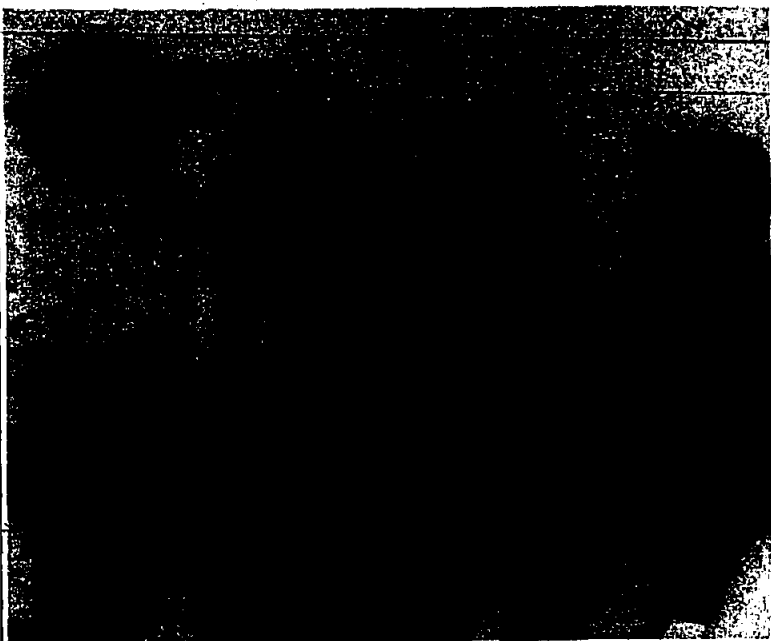


The entry fee for this tournament is \$125 per golfer. All proceeds of this tournament will go to the Rahway Hospital Building Fund.
