Court backs Merck in trade dispute

a spokeswoman for Merck & Co., Inc. of Rahway said June 7 the previouslyissued permanent injuncbarring a generic manufacturer from selling distributing domethacin capsules similar in appearance to Merck's

The permanent injunction, issued in October, 1984, barred Par Pharmaccutical, Inc. from trade dress (color, size and shape) to those marketed since 1965 by Merck under the trademark "Indocin."

The United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit on May 29 affirmed the earlier ruling by the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey in Newark.

The spokeswoman said the court found there is substantial generic nonlook-alike competition for the Merck product and Par adopted Merck's trade dress for an unfair competitive advantage.


