




Bank donates \$1,500 to CYRC programs

What does this mean to vegetable gardeners? It means that any bean blossoms that were forming during hot weather will probably fall off. Even if they don't, there won't be any beans produced from 7 to 10 days after the period of hot weather.

It takes 45 to 60 days (depending on the variety) for tomatoes to reach the red-ripe stage from blossom set. During this time span tomato production will be very small. There are some varieties of tomatoes that are more resistant to heat than others. However, the hot weather will Call 734-919
