

Waste plant trip favorable; many questions raised

According to survey results provided to The Rahway News-Record and to city officials recently by Coleman & Pellet of Union, the public relations firm handling the educational program on the proposed resource-recovery plant in Rahway, 98 percent of those who went on trips to the Peckskill, N.Y. facility and responded to a questionnaire handed out on each of the three trips had a positive reaction to that facility.

When asked to describe the plant in three words, both positively and negatively, 74 said "clean," 51 "efficient," 20 "odorless," 17 "impressive," 17 "attractive," 12 "necessary" and "needed" and seven "quiet."

Asked if they were able to detect any plant odors when they arrived in the parking lot of the facility 89 percent or 118 said no and 13 said yes.

In terms of cleanliness 99 percent or 131 described the mass-burning, resource-recovery process as clean. One hundred twenty-three or 93 percent said they could not see the garbage other than in the tipping area, and eight said they could.

The volume of truck traffic at or near the facility was described as medium to light by 91 percent or 120, medium by 52 percent or 69, light by 39 percent or 51 and heavy by 10 respondents. There was no response by one person.

Some of the questions asked were: How long will it take to begin operation? Will it cost Rahway anything to build this facility? If we decide to go for this type plant will the company we select be on bid basis? Does this company automatically get the job, or is it up for bid on what basis? Are we equipped "water wise" to handle such an installation? Is there enough water in the Rahway River to run this plant? Where will waste go? Landfill? How soon will it be built in Rahway? How many furnaces and boilers will we need for our county load of garbage? Truck congestion on city streets; noise, tax reduction to Rahway. What do we get? What amount of undesirable combustion materials are coming out of the stack? What advantages does it have for the city, including financial? Can there be tour tapes or television exposure to promote these facilities to the public so the public would be more educated about these facilities? In dollars and cents what would be the benefit to each individual taxpayer, approximately? Will Rahway tax reduction for residents be guaranteed? For how many years? Will garbage trucks be confined to Rte. No. 1?

Also, how can trucks be prevented from using residential streets? Will benefits to Rahway be guaranteed? How many trucks will pass through Rahway each day with garbage? This plant (Peckskill) is on a dead end road.

Where would the water come from for the cooling process? Could a dam be constructed to maintain a retention basin for adequate water supply and to maintain a water level upstream? The latter suggestion would be a great appearance benefit throughout the water course in the community. Would new trucks be necessary? Can Rahway handle added water from boiler blowdown? Will Rahway have the first shot on jobs?

What is the immediate future of the ash disposal (resulting from the resource-recovery process) in the gradually diminishing landfills? Additional questions included: What amount of energy will be created? Approximately how much water would be used or sold to the plant; percentage and profit to city? How do we, as taxpayers, benefit? Will it stay this way like the Peckskill plant) after years in operation? The cost? Will there be transfer stations? What are the guidelines for stack test? How often?

Following are some of the comments made on the three bus trips:

Cleaner and better than I had hoped for. Should consider routes of trucks in and out of Rahway, flood control and financial benefits.

A great idea, more so since you're soliciting cooperation from the public. Thanks for a great day. Clean, well-planned; no seagulls, rodents, mosquitoes. The citizens of Union County, especially of Rahway, must be well in-

formed of the entire resource-recovery process, otherwise negative responses will be generated. Films (such as the one we saw), brochures, and newspaper articles would be an excellent means of making the public aware. Definitely needed to keep up with the future of the vast amount of garbage that faces our future generations to dispose of. Plant odor was very slight and not unpleasant. We should have started two years ago. For the betterment of the community, I think Rahway should go ahead with this project. I think we need this type of facility in Rahway. It will greatly benefit us financially. Positive engineering to a great problem. Traffic heavy in afternoon, waiting as entrance. I recommend this facility for Rahway. This type of resource recovery plant is the only and best solution to our present problem of waste disposal. No answers for the problem of air inversion in the summer. It is something the city should go ahead with as fast as possible. Architecturally correct for the surrounding area.

Also, I like the speedy elimination of waste material and the cleanliness of the plant. Buy it! Get it built without any dishonesty, if possible. This is a better way to go than the landfill. Compared to landfill disposal there is no comparison. I think most strong objections are due to lack of information. Seems like the state-of-the-art method of waste disposal. Excellent

The council offered the following safety tips for vacation-traveling to the residents of Rahway during the summer:

1. **PLAN YOUR ROUTE:** Decide whether you want to travel on the Interstate Highways, which are faster and more direct, or on the older roads for a more leisurely scenic trip.

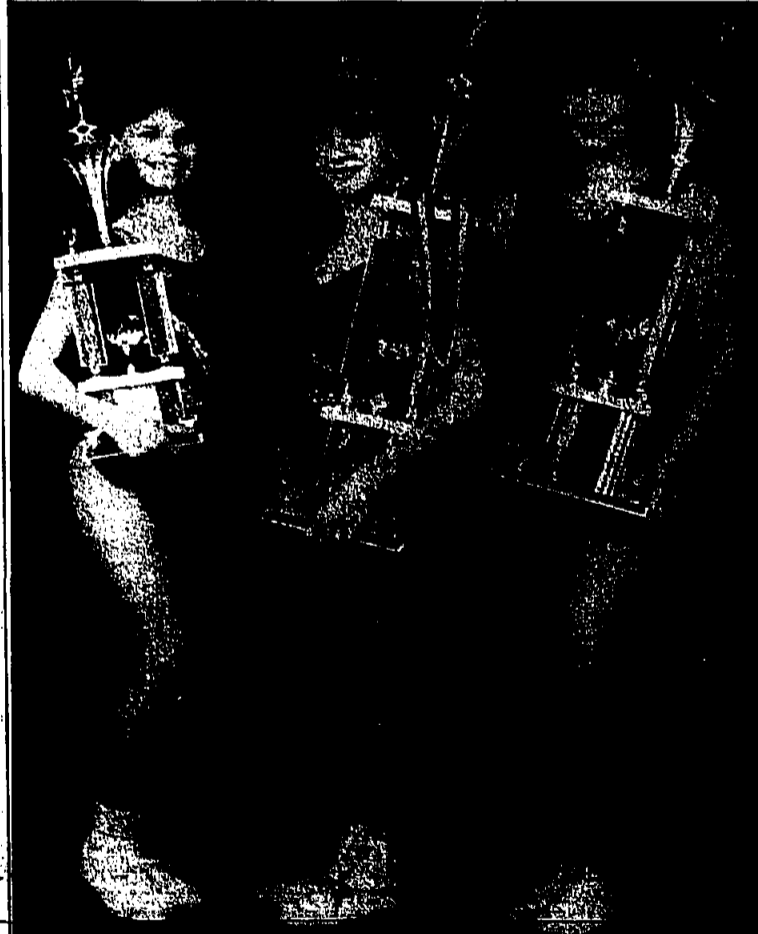
2. **PLAN DAILY DISTANCE:** Keep it realistic. Allow time to stop and visit interesting places and allow time for rest stops every couple of hours.

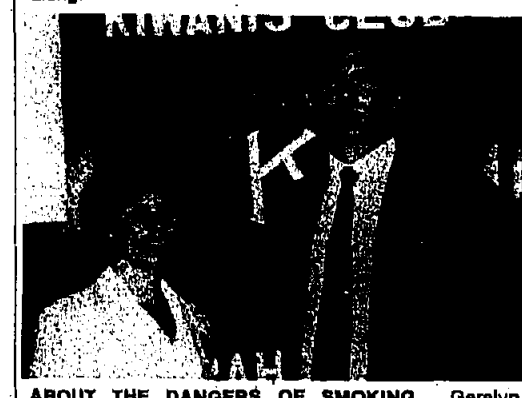
