

The process begins when unsenarated waste is dumped into the storage pit, from which it is transferred by overhead crane into the furnace, without having to be shredded or altered in any way.

In the furnace it is tumbled over a series of grates and burned at a temperature maintained for complete combustion of paper, cloth, and petroleum products bu combustion is collected from the storage pit and from other locations throughout the plant, virtually what words are associated with hostage.
