It was used in he sense of expressing appreciation to God. In fact, the first usage of the word in the colonies wa on Dec. 4, 1619, when it was applied to a totally religiou elebration. The occasion for this first Thanksgiving was the arrival of 39 English settlers at Berkeley Plantation or the James River near Charles City, Va. The first feast riented Thanksgiving in the New World was celebrated y the Plymouth colonists. The historic day was decreed y Gov. Bradford to be held on July 30, 1623. In 1789 President George Washington issued a general roclamation naming November 26 of that year a day of ational Thanksgiving. However, for many years following no regular nations Thanksgiving was observed in the United States until 1863 when President Abraham Lincoln declared the last
